Dear families of the Immaculate Heart of Mary

The Church uses these waning November days and darker skies as the season to remind us of the last things. Today's feast, the Solemnity of All Saints, is the centerpiece of three days that point to doctrines we proclaim each time we say the Apostles' Creed: "**We believe in the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body and life everlasting.**" And while the days and our hearts may be dark, the readings today are bright with the light of faith. John's vision in the book of Revelation reveals dazzling angels and white-robed saints gathered in triumph around the throne of God. In the responsorial psalm we sing our longing to see God's face, and in the second reading John writes that **we are God's children and will, in fact, see God "as He is"** (1 John 3:2). This is our hope. This is God's promise. Today we celebrate the triumph of those who already gaze on the face of God. Tomorrow we cry out for mercy with those in purgatory, who, like us on earth, still long to see God's face.

Over the past 7 1/2 months we longed to enter the church. We were eager to celebrate Mass within the walls. Although we felt blessed to have been able to attend in the Plaza, Meditation Garden, and for those who could not attend viewed the live stream, thanks to our devoted priests, staff and volunteers. Now we can begin to return to the House of God. You heard many times, do not be afraid.

Immaculate Heart of Mary, pray for us.

La Iglesia usa estos días que se acortan y los cielos oscuros como el tiempo para recordarnos las postrimerías de la vida. La fiesta de hoy, la Solemnidad de Todos los Santos, es el centro de tres días que nos presentan las doctrinas que proclamamos cada vez que rezamos el Credo de los Apóstoles: "**Creemos en la Iglesia católica, la comunión de los santos, el perdón de los pecados, la resurrección de los muertos y la vida perdurable**". 

Primera lectura

Apoc 7: 2-4. 9-14

Yo, Juan, vi a un ángel que venía del oriente. Traía consigo el sello del Dios vivo y gritaba con voz poderosa a los cuatro ángeles encargados de hacer daño a la tierra y al mar. Les dijo: “¡No hagan daño a la tierra, ni al mar, ni a los árboles, hasta que terminemos de marcar con el sello la frente de los servidores de nuestro Dios!” Y pude oír el número de los que habían sido marcados: eran ciento cuarenta y cuatro mil, procedentes de todas las tribus de Israel.

Vi luego una muchedumbre tan grande, que nadie podía contarla. Eran individuos de todas las naciones y razas, de todos los pueblos y lenguas. Todos estaban de pie, delante del trono y del Cordero; iban vestidos con una túnica blanca; llevaban palmas en las manos y exclamaban con voz poderosa: “La salvación viene de nuestro Dios, que está sentado en el trono, y del Cordero”.

Y todos los ángeles que estaban alrededor del trono, de los ancianos y de los cuatro seres vivientes, cayeron rostro en tierra delante del trono y adoraron a Dios, diciendo: “Amén. La alabanza, la gloria, la sabiduría, la acción de gracias, el honor, el poder y la fuerza, se le deben para siempre a nuestro Dios”.

First Reading

Rv 7:2-4, 9-14

I, John, saw another angel come up from the East, holding the seal of the living God. He cried out in a loud voice to the four angels who were given power to damage the land and the sea, "Do not damage the land or the sea or the trees until we put the seal on the foreheads of the servants of our God." I heard the number of those who had been marked with the seal, one hundred and forty-four thousand marked from every tribe of the children of Israel. After this I had a vision of a great multitude, which no one could count, from every nation, race, people, and tongue. They stood before the throne and before the Lamb, wearing white robes and holding palm branches in their hands. They cried out in a loud voice: "Salvation comes from our God, who is seated on the throne, and from the Lamb."

All the angels stood around the throne and around the elders and the four living creatures. They prostrated themselves before the throne, worshiped God, and exclaimed: "Amen. Blessing and glory, wisdom and thanksgiving, honor, power, and might be to our God forever and ever. Amen." Then one of the elders spoke up and said to me, "Who are these wearing white robes, and where did they come from?" I said to him, "My lord, you are the one who knows." He said to me, "These are the ones who have survived the time of great distress; they have washed their robes and made them white in the Blood of the Lamb."

Blessed are the clean of heart, for they will see God. Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God. Blessed are they who are persecuted for the sake of righteousness, for theirs is the Kingdom of heaven. Blessed are you when they insult you and persecute you and utter every kind of evil against you falsely because of me. Rejoice and be glad, for your reward will be great in heaven."

The Nicene Creed

I believe in one God,
the Father almighty,
maker of heaven and earth,
of all things visible and invisible.

All Souls' Day, in Roman Catholicism, a day for commemoration of all the faithful departed, those baptized Christians who are believed to be in purgatory because they died with the guilt of lesser sins on their souls. It is observed on November 2. Roman Catholic doctrine holds that the prayers of the faithful on earth will help cleanse these souls in order to fit them for the vision of God in heaven, and the day is dedicated to prayer and remembrance. Requiem masses are commonly held, and many people visit and sometimes decorate the graves of loved ones.



From antiquity certain days were devoted to intercession for particular groups of the dead. The institution of a day for a general intercession on November 2 is due to Odilo, abbot of Cluny (died 1048). The date, which became practically universal before the end of the 13th century, was chosen to follow All Saints' Day. Having celebrated the feast of all the members of the church who are believed to be in heaven, the church on earth turns, on the next day, to commemorate those souls believed to be suffering in purgatory.

Priests celebrate mass wearing vestments of varying colour—black (for mourning), violet (symbolizing penance), or white (symbolizing the hope of resurrection).

Dear parishioners of IHM, as we are now able to attend Mass in church (at about 25% capacity), we have not enforced a dress code while attending in the Plaza. Here is an article that we found regarding "Appropriate Clothing for Mass."

When it comes to appropriate clothing for attending Mass, we are not as strict as Saint Peter's Basilica in Vatican City (Rome), where they won't let people in the door if they are not covered properly, but we hope you will always choose to wear reverent clothing whenever you come to our Church for Mass, weddings, funerals and other liturgies. We have no doubt that God loves you as you are, but clothing does shape the mind and heart to fulfill our purpose in the plan God has established for human life.

Although shorts are not permitted at Saint Peter's church (at the Vatican City in Rome), we do ask that those who wear shorts in our church select dressy casual shorts that go to near the knee and women and girls who wear dresses select dresses that go to or nearly to the knees. Gym shorts, shorty-shorts, bare shoulders, and low necklines should be avoided. Layers can help you dress for Mass and be ready for more casual events after you leave the church. Light sweaters or shawls are easy to wear inside and to take off outside. We know it is often hot outside, but that does not mean we should be overly casual inside the church.

Thank you for helping all of us keep our focus on worshipping God.

The Story of the Solemnity of All Saints

The earliest certain observance of a feast in honor of all the saints is an early fourth-century commemoration of "all the martyrs." In the early seventh century, after successive waves of invaders plundered the catacombs, Pope Boniface IV gathered up some 28 wagon-loads of bones and reinterred them beneath the Pantheon, a Roman temple dedicated to all the gods. The pope rededicated the shrine as a Christian church. According to Venerable Bede, the pope intended "that the memory of all the saints might in the future be honored in the place which had formerly been dedicated to the worship not of gods but of demons" (*On the Calculation of Time*).

But the rededication of the Pantheon, like the earlier commemoration of all the martyrs, occurred in May. Many Eastern Churches still honor all the saints in the spring, either during the Easter season or immediately after Pentecost.

How the Western Church came to celebrate this feast, now recognized as a solemnity, in November is a puzzle to historians. The Anglo-Saxon theologian Alcuin observed the feast on November 1 in 800, as did his friend Arno, Bishop of Salzburg. Rome finally adopted that date in the ninth century.

Reflection

This feast first honored martyrs. Later, when Christians were free to worship according to their consciences, the Church acknowledged other paths to sanctity. In the early centuries the only criterion was popular acclaim, even when the bishop's approval became the final step in placing a commemoration on the calendar. The first papal canonization occurred in 993; the lengthy process now required to prove extraordinary sanctity took form in the last 500 years. Today's feast honors the obscure as well as the famous—the saints each of us have known.


