Dear families of the Immaculate Heart of Mary,

In this third Sunday of our reading from the Sermon on the Plain, Jesus speaks of the inner soul and its outer expression. He uses images as he teaches. He addresses all of us.

Jesus sees a plumb line connecting the soul with the soul's expression-words and actions. He uses exaggeration to drive home his point. We are urged to clear out the debris that blinds us. He knows that we have an uncanny ability to be blind to our own weaknesses, though they are as big as a board. He knows, too, how willingly we seem to ferret out others' smallest speck-like flaws.

And this, too, is for our general consumption; solid old goodness and solid old badness will show eventually. The old Latin saying, which echoes Jesus' images, is true: "What is bred in the bone will out in the flesh." By and by, the inside will show through.

This Wednesday is the beginning of Lent and Ash Wednesday. We will have Masses at 8am and 10am in English, 12pm Bilingual, 5pm Latin, and 7pm Spanish. Ashes will be distributed for all those at Mass. No ashes will be given to those to take home.

Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Sir 27:4-7 | 1 Cor 15:54-58 | Lk 6:39-45

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

It can be uncomfortable to admit, but our speech habits can truly reveal our interior life. Too often, I've fallen prey to the temptation of gossip or other alluring but unbecoming forms of conversation. Perhaps we all have to some degree, which is why today's words from Sirach capture our attention: "When a sieve is shaken, the husks appear; so do one's faults when one speaks." This theme of speech being connected to our hearts is woven throughout Scripture, and it both challenges and encourages us. Before God came to us in the flesh, he came to us as the *Word*. Our words carry eternal weight; they have the power to bless or to curse. For this reason, the Scriptures today challenge us to seek the guidance of the Holy Spirit, our Advocate, in order to grow in virtue so that our speech may reflect his glory and our words echo his truth.

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

In today's parable from Luke's Gospel, Jesus asks, "Why do you notice the splinter in your brother's eye, but do not perceive the wooden beam in your own?" Ouch. Am I the only one who shifts uncomfortably when reading this? How often and how easily do we fixate on the way others have caused us frustration, discomfort, or hurt? While those things may (or may not) be true, it feels so easy to dismiss personal responsibility. In this passage, Jesus lovingly teaches us that when we live this way, we remain stuck in our patterns of sin. But he also gives us another option: "Remove the wooden beam from your eye first; then you will see clearly." It is through this honest examination of conscience and cleansing of our own sin that we come to know God more fully, and as our vision is cleared, become more aware of how his beauty and mercy surround us.

REFLECT

Today, let us pray for a deeper personal conversion through an honest examination of conscience, so that as we empty ourselves from our sinful ways, we may become more tethered to God's holy will, speaking his truth and living in his light. Commit to praying an Act of Contrition each day this week and ask the Holy Spirit to help you grow in virtue.

St. Katharine Drexel – March 3

Jesus talks about how difficult it is for a rich man to enter heaven. He compares it to a camel passing through the eye of a needle. This week, the church celebrates a modern saint who learned from her wealthy father at an early age how to use that wealth for the Glory of God.

Catherine Mary Drexel was born in 1858 in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. Her family earned their considerable wealth from banking. Her uncle, Anthony Drexel, founded Drexel University in Philadelphia. Her mother died five weeks after giving birth to Catherine.

Their father taught Catherine and her sister that a person's money was meant to be shared with others. Their house was regularly opened to distribute food and clothing to the poor. Her father died in 1885, and Catherine was a beneficiary of his vast estate. She traveled the country and saw firsthand the difficulties both Native Americans and African Americans were having in rural America. The following year, she traveled abroad and had an audience with Pope Leo XIII. He urged her to become a missionary in America and assist the Native and African American populations.

1891, she founded the Sisters of the Blessed Sacrament, taking the religious name Katharine. She focused her efforts on the southern and western United States. She used the income from her father's trust, \$350,000 a year in the 1900s, to build over sixty schools in the rural south and west. She established Xavier University in New Orleans. She served as her congregation's Superior General until 1937 when illness required her to live in prayerful retirement. Over her lifetime, she gave more than 21 million dollars to help fund and build churches, schools, and hospitals across the United States.

Katharine derived her immense spiritual strength from her devotion to the Eucharist. She once wrote the prayer she prayed daily in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament, "Help me each moment today and always to communicate myself to you by doing your will. Let the doing of your will each moment be a spiritual communion. In it, you will give me yourself. I will give you myself."

St. Katharine Drexel, pray for us, Immaculate Heart of Mary, pray for us!

Santa Catalina Drexel - 3 de marzo

Jesús habla de lo difícil que es para un rico entrar en el cielo. Lo compara con un camello que pasa por el ojo de una aguja. Esta semana, la Iglesia celebra a una santa moderna que aprendió de su padre rico a una edad temprana cómo utilizar esa riqueza para la gloria de Dios.

Catalina María Drexel nació en 1858 en Filadelfia, Pensilvania. Su familia se enriqueció con la banca. Su tío, Anthony Drexel, fundó la Universidad Drexel en Filadelfia. Su madre murió cinco semanas después de dar a luz a Catherine.

Su padre enseñó a Catherine y a su hermana que el dinero de una persona debía compartirse con los demás. Su casa se abría regularmente para distribuir comida y ropa a los pobres. Su padre murió en 1885, y Katherine fue beneficiaria de su vasto patrimonio. Viajó por todo el país y vio de primera mano las dificultades que tenían tanto los nativos americanos como los afroamericanos en la América rural. Al año siguiente viajó al extranjero y tuvo una audiencia con el Papa León XIII. Este la instó a convertirse en misionera en América y ayudar a las poblaciones nativas y afroamericanas.

En 1891, fundó las Hermanas del Santísimo Sacramento, tomando el nombre religioso de Katharine. Centró sus esfuerzos en el sur y el oeste de Estados Unidos. Utilizó los ingresos del fideicomiso de su padre, 350.000 dólares anuales en la década de 1900, para construir más de sesenta escuelas en las zonas rurales del sur y el oeste. Creó la Universidad Xavier en Nueva Orleans. Fue Superiora General de su congregación hasta 1937, cuando una enfermedad la obligó a retirarse en oración. A lo largo de su vida, donó más de 21 millones de dólares para ayudar a financiar y construir iglesias, escuelas y hospitales en todo Estados Unidos.

La inmensa fuerza espiritual de Catalina provenía de su devoción a la Eucaristía. Una vez escribió la oración que rezaba diariamente en presencia del Santísimo Sacramento: «Ayúdame en cada momento, hoy y siempre, a comunicarme contigo haciendo tu voluntad. Que el hacer tu voluntad en cada momento sea una comunión espiritual. En ella, tú me darás a ti mismo. Yo te daré a mí misma».
