Dear families of the Immaculate Heart of Mary,

In previous weeks we have seen how the theme of covenant-as a preparation for the baptismal covenant celebrated at Easteroccupies an important place in our cycle of Lenten readings. The notion of covenant as a relationship between two parties carries with it an expectation of mutual accountability and fidelity to the terms of the covenant. When God forged the covenant with the Jewish people on Mt. Sinai, it was a pledge of God's protection, and it would forever permit them familiar access as the Chosen People. For their part, the Jewish people were to observe the dictates of the law, summarized most succinctly here in the form of the Ten Commandments. To be in a covenantal relationship with the Lord God requires an exclusive relationship, just as discipleship with Jesus—ritualized in baptism—demands a total allegiance to him and none other.

We have now been able to attend Mass in person for the last two weeks. How wonderful that we stayed faithful and God has blessed us. Remember during this Lent to not only repent and fast but to give glory to God for all his blessings to us.

Desde hace dos semanas podemos asistir a la misa en persona. Que maravilloso que nos hayamos mantenido fieles y que Dios nos haya bendecido. Recuerden durante esta Cuaresma no sólo arrepentirse y ayunar sino dar gloria a Dios por todas sus bendiciones para nosotros.

#### Lectura

#### Primera lectura

<u>Ex 17, 3-7</u>

En aquellos días, el pueblo, torturado por la sed, fue a protestar contra Moisés, diciéndole: "¿Nos has hecho salir de Egipto para hacernos morir de sed a nosotros, a nuestros hijos y a nuestro ganado?" Moisés clamó al Señor y le dijo: "¿Qué puedo hacer con este pueblo? Sólo falta que me apedreen". Respondió el Señor a Moisés: "Preséntate al pueblo, llevando contigo a algunos de los ancianos de Israel, toma en tu mano el cayado con que golpeaste el Nilo y vete. Yo estaré ante ti, sobre la peña, en Horeb. Golpea la peña y saldrá de ella agua para que beba el pueblo".

Así lo hizo Moisés a la vista de los ancianos de Israel y puso por nombre a aquel lugar Masá y Meribá, por la rebelión de los hijos de Israel y porque habían tentado al Señor, diciendo: "¿Está o no está el Señor en medio de nosotros?"

#### Segunda Lectura

<u>Rm 5, 1-2. 5-8</u>

Hermanos: Ya que hemos sido justificados por la fe, mantengámonos en paz con Dios, por mediación de nuestro Señor Jesucristo. Por él hemos obtenido, con la fe, la entrada al mundo de la gracia, en el cual nos encontramos; por él, podemos gloriarnos de tener la esperanza de participar en la gloria de Dios. La esperanza no defrauda, porque Dios ha infundido su amor en nuestros corazones por medio del Espíritu Santo, que él mismo nos ha dado. En efecto, cuando todavía no teníamos fuerzas para salir del pecado, Cristo murió por los pecadores en el tiempo señalado. Difícilmente habrá alguien que quiera morir por un justo, aunque puede haber alguno que esté dispuesto a morir por una persona sumamente buena. Y la prueba de que Dios nos ama está en que Cristo murió por nosotros, cuando aún éramos pecadores.

#### Evangelio

Jn 2:13-25

Cuando se acercaba la Pascua de los judíos, Jesús llegó a Jerusalén y encontró en el templo a los vendedores de bueyes, ovejas y palomas, y a los cambistas con sus mesas. Entonces hizo un látigo de cordeles y los echó del templo, con todo y sus ovejas y bueyes; a los cambistas les volcó las mesas y les tiró al suelo las monedas; y a los que vendían palomas les dijo: "Quiten todo de aquí y no conviertan en un mercado la casa de mi Padre".

En ese momento, sus discípulos se acordaron de lo que estaba escrito: *El celo de tu casa me devora.* 

Después intervinieron los judíos para preguntarle: "¿Qué señal nos das de que tienes autoridad para actuar así?" Jesús les respondió: "Destruyan este templo y en tres días lo reconstruiré". Replicaron los judíos: "Cuarenta y seis años se ha llevado la construcción del templo, ¿y tú lo vas a levantar en tres días?" Pero él hablaba del templo de su cuerpo. Por eso, cuando resucitó Jesús de entre los muertos, se acordaron sus discípulos de que había dicho aquello y creyeron en la Escritura y en las palabras que Jesús había dicho.

Mientras estuvo en Jerusalén para las fiestas de Pascua, muchos creyeron en él, al ver los prodigios que hacía. Pero Jesús no se fiaba de ellos, porque los conocía a todos y no necesitaba que nadie le descubriera lo que es el hombre, porque él sabía lo que hay en el hombre.

<u>Jn 4:5-42</u>

Jesus came to a town of Samaria called Sychar, near the plot of land that Jacob had given to his son Joseph. Jacob's well was there.

Jesus, tired from his journey, sat down there at the well. It was about noon.

A woman of Samaria came to draw water.

Jesus said to her, "Give me a drink."

His disciples had gone into the town to buy food.

The Samaritan woman said to him, "How can you, a Jew, ask me, a Samaritan woman, for a drink?"

—For Jews use nothing in common with Samaritans— Jesus answered and said to her, "If you knew the gift of God and who is saying to you, 'Give me a drink,

<u>Ex 17, 3-7</u> you would have asked him and he would have given you living water."

The woman said to him, "Sir, you do not even have a bucket and the cistern is deep;

where then can you get this living water? Are you greater than our father Jacob, who gave us this cistern and drank from it himself with his children and his flocks?"

Jesus answered and said to her, "Everyone who drinks this water will be thirsty again; but whoever drinks the water I shall give will never thirst; the water I shall give will become in him a spring of water welling up to eternal life."

The woman said to him, "Sir, give me this water, so that I may not be thirsty or have to keep coming here to draw water."

Jesus said to her, "Go call your husband and come back." The woman answered and said to him, "I do not have a husband."

Jesus answered her, "You are right in saying, 'I do not have a husband.'

For you have had five husbands, and the one you have now is not your husband.

What you have said is true." The woman said to him, "Sir, I can see that you are a prophet.

Our ancestors worshiped on this mountain;

but you people say that the place to worship is in Jerusalem."

Jesus said to her, "Believe me, woman, the hour is coming when you will worship the Father neither on this mountain nor in Jerusalem.

You people worship what you do not understand; we worship what we understand, because salvation is from the Jews.

But the hour is coming, and is now here, when true worshipers will worship the Father in Spirit and truth; and indeed the Father seeks such people to worship him. God is Spirit, and those who worship him must worship in Spirit and truth."

The woman said to him, "I know that the Messiah is coming, the one called the Christ; when he comes, he will tell us everything."

Jesus said to her, "I am he, the one speaking with you."

At that moment his disciples returned,

and were amazed that he was talking with a woman, but still no one said, "What are you looking for?"

or "Why are you talking with her?"

The woman left her water jar

and went into the town and said to the people, "Come see a man who told me everything I have done.

Could he possibly be the Christ?"

They went out of the town and came to him.

Meanwhile, the disciples urged him, "Rabbi, eat." But he said to them,

"I have food to eat of which you do not know."

So the disciples said to one another,

"Could someone have brought him something to eat?" Jesus said to them,

"My food is to do the will of the one who sent me 5 and to finish his work. (continued —>)

Do you not say, 'In four months the harvest will be here'?

I tell you, look up and see the fields ripe for the harvest. The reaper is already receiving payment and gathering crops for eternal life,

so that the sower and reaper can rejoice together. For here the saying is verified that 'One sows and another reaps.<sup>1</sup>

I sent you to reap what you have not worked for; others have done the work,

and you are sharing the fruits of their work."

Many of the Samaritans of that town began to believe in him because of the word of the woman who testified,

"He told me everything I have done."

When the Samaritans came to him,

they invited him to stay with them;

and he stayed there two days.

Many more began to believe in him because of his

word, and they said to the woman,

"We no longer believe because of your word;

for we have heard for ourselves, and we know that this is truly the savior of the world."

**Gospel (Sunday)** 

Jn 2:13-25

Since the Passover of the Jews was near, Jesus went up to Jerusalem.

He found in the temple area those who sold oxen, sheep, and doves, as well as the money changers seated there.

He made a whip out of cords

and drove them all out of the temple area, with the sheep and oxen, and spilled the coins of the money changers and overturned their tables, and to those who sold doves he said,

"Take these out of here.

and stop making my Father's house a marketplace." His disciples recalled the words of Scripture,

Zeal for your house will consume me.

At this the Jews answered and said to him, "What sign can you show us for doing this?"

Jesus answered and said to them, Destroy this temple and in three days I will raise it up."

The Jews said, "This temple has been under

construction for forty-six years, and you will raise it up in three days?"

But he was speaking about the temple of his body.

Therefore, when he was raised from the dead, his disciples remembered that he had said this, and they came to believe the Scripture and the word Jesus had spoken. While he was in Jerusalem for the feast of Passover, many began to believe in his name when they saw the signs he was doing. But Jesus would not trust himself to them because he knew them all, and did not need anyone to testify about human nature.

He himself understood it well.

#### **The Nicene Creed**

I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible.

I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.

I and probably many others soon forgot about the "something else." Are we in danger of neglecting the sacrificial aspect of following Jesus? We never hear anything about this from the pulpit.

**A**: On Feb. 17, 1966, Pope Paul VI issued *Poenitemini*, an apostolic constitution that established Ash Wednesday and Good Friday as days of fast and abstinence worldwide and allowed conferences of bishops to establish other days and/or practices. Nine months later, the U.S. bishops issued a statement urging Catholics to observe all Fridays as a penitential day but without the obligation to abstain from meat on Fridays outside Lent; that statement is available at **usccb.org**. The bishops pointed out that Christians can claim no exception from being sinners and can claim no exemption from the obligation to do penance.

This could mean abstaining from something or it could involve engaging in some work of mercy, such as visiting the sick or working in a soup kitchen, at a homeless shelter or with a similar group. Sections 1434 through 1439 in the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* address the many forms of penance in the Christian life.

Pope Benedict XVI's 2012 Lenten message was based on Hebrews 10:24, "*Let us be concerned for each other, to stir a response in love and good works."* Doing penance is part of our living truthfully before God and in relation to other people.
