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Dear families of the Immaculate Heart of Mary,

Jesus knew that the scribes and Pharisees were trying to trap him. They put him in what seemed to be a no-win situation. Let the woman who was caught in adultery go, and he would have been accused of ignoring the law. Let her be stoned, and he would fail to show mercy toward her, contradicting his life's message. Jesus' response teaches three crucial lessons: none of us is free of sin; we are not the ultimate judges of others; Jesus is the mercy of God, in whom we can always trust. In Christ, God does something new. When we give our hearts to Christ, we have the hope of new life, a life in which mercy reigns.

Lent is a time for us to be renewed. It is a time for us to acknowledge how merciful our God is and how much he loves us by sending his only Son down to die for our sins. How much are we willing to do to show Christ that we too have a great love not only for the Father but also others. Lent is almost over but it is not too late for us to thank and praise God for his love and mercy.

So the sisters sent word to him saying,
"Master, the one you love is ill."
when Jesus heard this he said,
"This illness is not to end in death,
but is for the glory of God,
that the Son of God may be glorified through it."
Now Jesus loved Martha and her sister and
Lazarus.
So when he heard that he was ill,
he remained for two days in the place where he
was.
Then after this he said to his disciples,
"Let us go back to Judea."
The disciples said to him,
"Rabbi, the Jews were just trying to stone you,
and you want to go back there?"

Ez 37:12-14 Jesus answered,
If one walks during the day,
he does not stumble,
because he sees the light of this world.
But if one walks at night, he stumbles,
because the light is not in him." He said this, and then told them,
"Our friend Lazarus is asleep,
but I am going to awaken him." So the disciples said to him,
"Master, if he is asleep, he will be saved." But Jesus was talking about his death,
while they thought that he meant ordinary sleep. So then Jesus said to them clearly,
"Lazarus has died. And I am glad for you that I was not there,
that you may believe. Let us go to him." So Thomas, called Didymus,
said to his fellow disciples,
"Let us also go to die with him." When Jesus arrived, he found that Lazarus
had already been in the tomb for four days. Now Bethany was near Jerusalem,
only about two miles away. And many of the Jews had come to Martha and
Mary to comfort them about their brother. When Martha heard that Jesus was coming,
she went to meet him;
but Mary sat at home. Martha said to Jesus,
"Lord, if you had been here,
my brother would not have died. But even now I know that whatever you ask of
God, God will give you." Jesus said to her,
"Your brother will rise." Martha said to him,
"I know he will rise,
in the resurrection on the last day." Jesus told her,
"I am the resurrection and the life;
whoever believes in me, even if he dies, will live,
and everyone who lives and believes in me will
never die. Do you believe this?" She said to him, "Yes, Lord. I have come to believe that you are the Christ, the
Son of God,
the one who is coming into the world." When she had said this,
she went and called her sister Mary secretly,
saying,
"The teacher is here and is asking for you." As soon as she heard this,
she rose quickly and went to him. For Jesus had not yet come into the village,
but was still where Martha had met him. So when the Jews who were with her in the house
comforting her saw Mary get up quickly and go
out, they followed her,

presuming that she was going to the tomb to weep there.
When Mary came to where Jesus was and saw him,
she fell at his feet and said to him,
"Lord, if you had been here,
my brother would not have died."
When Jesus saw her weeping and the Jews who had come with her weeping,
he became perturbed and deeply troubled, and said,
"Where have you laid him?"
They said to him, "Sir, come and see."
And Jesus wept.
So the Jews said, "See how he loved him."
But some of them said,
"Could not the one who opened the eyes of the blind man have done something so that this man would not have died?"
So Jesus, perturbed again, came to the tomb.
It was a cave, and a stone lay across it.
Jesus said, "Take away the stone."
Martha, the dead man's sister, said to him,
"Lord, by now there will be a stench;
he has been dead for four days."
Jesus said to her,
"Did I not tell you that if you believe you will see the glory of God?"
So they took away the stone.
And Jesus raised his eyes and said,
"Father, I thank you for hearing me.
I know that you always hear me;
but because of the crowd here I have said this,
that they may believe that you sent me."
And when he had said this,
He cried out in a loud voice,
"Lazarus, come out!"
The dead man came out,
tied hand and foot with burial bands,
and his face was wrapped in a cloth.
So Jesus said to them,
"Untie him and let him go."

Now many of the Jews who had come to Mary and seen what he had done began to believe in him.

Segunda Lectura

Fil 3, 8-14

Evangelio

Jn 8, 1-11

En aquel tiempo, Jesús se retiró al monte de los Olivos y al amanecer se presentó de nuevo en el templo, donde la multitud se le acercaba; y él, sentado entre ellos, les enseñaba.

Entonces los escribas y fariseos le llevaron a una mujer sorprendida en adulterio, y poniéndola frente a él, le dijeron: “Maestro, esta mujer ha sido sorprendida en flagrante adulterio.

Moisés nos manda en la ley apedrear a estas mujeres. ¿Tú que dices?" Le preguntaban esto para ponerle una trampa y poder acusarlo. Pero Jesús se agachó y se puso a escribir en el suelo con el dedo. Como insistían en su pregunta, se incorporó y les dijo: "Aquel de ustedes que no tenga pecado, que le tire la primera piedra". Se volvió a agachar y siguió escribiendo en el suelo.



Keynote speaker: Bishop Michael Barber, SJ

After being ordained a priest for the Society of Jesus on June 8, 1985, in San Francisco, Bishop Barber continued his studies in Rome and at Oxford University. In 1991 he became a commissioned officer in the United States Naval Reserve and achieved the rank of Captain in 2012. He has served as Group Chaplain for the Marine Aircraft Group, as Deputy Division Chaplain for the 4th Marine Division and Deputy Force Chaplain for Reserve Affairs for Marine Forces Pacific, among many other assignments. Pope Francis appointed him as bishop of Oakland on May 3, 2013, the first American bishop appointed by Pope Francis. He was consecrated and installed on May 25, 2013. He returns to the IHM Men's Power Conference for a second year and to offer the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass & answering our questions.

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IHM is a strong Pro-Life parish.

The Pro-Life ministry exists to educate and create a "culture of life" by standing on God's teachings on the dignity of all life. We do this through prayer by praying for the end of abortion at all masses, praying at Planned Parenthood weekly, providing critical information in the vestibule at all times, supporting the West Coast Walk for Life and Project Gabriel, which reaches out and assists women in crisis. SIN AND VIRTUE SERIES (CONT'D)

SIN AND VIRTUE XIV The Sin of Greed

British playwright and novelist Dorothy Sayers once wrote an essay titled "The Other Six Deadly Sins" in which she gave a description of greed such as I had never heard before, and which really opened up my understanding. Greed, Sayers said, used to be Scrooge-like; pinched, narrow, closed-in on itself, a matter of hoarded money stuffed under a mattress, never used for any good or enjoyment, money piled up for the sake of money itself. This is an accurate enough portrayal of the sin of greed, but there is another manifestation of it in our day, and Sayers' explored this manifestation in her essay.

Greed in our time, Sayers argued, has become glamorous and fashionable. It is no longer called by its proper name, it now sails forth under such titles as "enterprise" and "ambition" and "entrepreneurship." It is lauded in the popular media (PEOPLE magazine's cover stories on how much the Kardashians make from product placement on their reality show, for instance) and in more refined publications as well, such as FORBES, with its annual "400 wealthiest" list. The acquisition, and hoarding, of money is hailed as a worthy goal and a laudable achievement.

Greed is still, however, what it always was. Selfish, narrow and lifeless. It fundamentally mistakes the very reason for the existence of money. Money is a means to various ends, good or bad. When money becomes the end in itself, greed is at work. One need not be rich to be greedy. It is a matter of an attitude about money. The greedy lack perspective and compassion. Their sin blinds them to the good that they could bring about, by being generous, by putting their extra money to good works. In taking and not giving back, they contribute to the poverty of much of the world, and ironically, to the extent that greed rules them, they are themselves impoverished emotionally and spiritually.

Generosity fights greed. So do several other virtues. We'll talk about them .

PECADO Y VIRTUD XIV El Pecado de la Avaricia

Una dramaturga y novelista Inglesa, Dorothy Sayers una vez escribió una composición titulada "Los Otros Seis Pecados Mortales" en la cual dio tal descripción de la avaricia que yo nunca había oido antes, lo cual abrió completamente mi entendimiento. Avaricia, Sayer dijo, era como "avaro," encerrado en si mismo, de mente cerrada, oprimido, con una manera de acumular dinero y ponerlo debajo del colchón de la cama, nunca para ser usado para el bien ni para disfrutar algo, dinero amontonado por ser solamente dinero. Esta es una descripción bastante clara del pecado de la avaricia, pero hay otra manifestación de esto en nuestro tiempo, y Sayer exploró esta manifestación en una composición.

Avaricia en nuestro tiempo, discutió Sayer, se ha vuelto de moda y fascinante. Ya no se llama por su propio nombre, hoy en dia sigue adelante con titulos como "ENTERPRISE" y "Ambición." Esta muy alabado en la noticias populares (como noticias sensacionales en la Revista People de cuanto ganan las Kardashians en los productos que usan en su programa realista de la television, como un ejemplo) y también en otras publicaciones mas distinguidas tal como FORBES, con su lista anual de las "400 personas mas ricas." La adquisición, y la acumulación, de dinero es aclamado como una meta valorosa y una hazaña heroica.

Avaricia todavia es lo que siempre ha sido. Egoista, de mente encerrada y sin vida. Fundamentalmente equivoca la razón de la existencia del dinero. El dinero es un medio para ciertos fines, tanto buenos como malos. Cuando el dinero se vuelve el fin, entonces la avaricia está trabajando. Uno no necesita ser rico para ser avaro. Es una actitud sobre el dinero. El avaro no tiene perspectiva ni compasión. Su pecado lo ciega del bien que ellos podrían hacer, siendo generosos, poniendo su dinero extra en buenos trabajos. En tomar y no dar de regreso, ellos contribuyen a la pobreza de una gran parte del mundo, e ironicamente al punto que la avaricia los controla, ellos en si, son pobres emocionalmente y espiritualmente. Generosidad lucha con la avaricia. También lo hacen otras virtudes. Hablaremos de ellas pronto.

SIN AND VIRTUE XV

Virtues that Fight Greed

Generosity, of course, is the principal antidote to greed. This virtue is listed by St. Paul as one of the fruits of the Spirit (Galatians 5:22-23) and if we pray for it, we may be confident that the Spirit, always lavish in giving to us, will gift us with this virtue.

Generous people give more than just money, but they possess an attitude about money that immunizes them from greed. They understand that money, strictly speaking, has no value in itself. Its value is in relation to what can be accomplished with it. The generous see money in terms of opportunity to make the world a better place for other people, and spend and give accordingly. They have discovered the joy in giving and this joy makes giving easy for them.

Just as one need not be rich to be greedy, one need not be rich to be generous. It is all about attitude, conviction, and a general predisposition, a set of personal inclinations. It is probably true that greed is driven above all by some kind of insecurity or fear; generosity can require courage. Once developed as a habit, however, generosity rewards itself in ways beyond mere financial considerations. The generous heart not only gives freely but, because it is a large and open heart, it also receives abundantly. The more we give the more we have to give, because by giving we make room in our hearts to receive. There is a spiritual dynamic at work here, summed up by Jesus Himself when he says "To those that have, more will be given; to those that have not, even what they seem to have will be taken away." (Luke 19:26)

Temperance (moderation) also fights greed, for greed is the immoderate love of money. Kindness and compassion fight greed, for they take us into the experience of others, and create in us the longing to help. Justice, the thirst for righteousness, also fights greed. The man or woman with a well-developed sense of justice sees in his or her surplus wealth an opportunity to redress some of the injustices endured by those less fortunate. So, as is the case with lust, which is opposed by many virtues, those who struggle with the sin of greed have the opportunity, in that struggle, to develop several virtues at once.

PECADO Y VIRTUD XV

Virtudes que luchan la avaricia

Generosidad, por ejemplo, es el principal antídoto de la avaricia. La virtud está en la lista mencionada por San Pablo como uno de los frutos del Espíritu (Galateos 5:22-23) y si nosotros rezamos por él, podremos estar seguros que el Espíritu siempre nos desparramará en darnos esto, nos dotará con esta virtud.

La gente generosa da más que solamente el dinero, pero ellos poseen una actitud sobre el dinero que los protege de la avaricia. Ellos entienden que el dinero, estrictamente hablando, no tiene valor por sí mismo. Su valor es en relación de lo que se puede hacer con él. Los generosos ven al dinero como una oportunidad de mejorar al mundo para otras personas y por eso gastan y dan a otros. Ellos descubrieron la alegría en dar y esta alegría hace dar más fácil.

uno no necesita ser rico para ser avaro, uno no necesita ser rico para ser generoso. Es todo un caso de actitud, convicción y una predisposición general, son un par de inclinaciones personales. Probablemente será verdad que la avaricia es dirigida sobre todo por un tipo de inseguridad o miedo; generosidad requiere valor. Una vez que esto se vuelve un hábito, la generosidad nos recompensa en maneras más allá de las puras consideraciones financieras. El Corazón generoso no solamente da libremente pero, porque es un Corazón abierto y grande, también recibe abundantemente. Mientras más damos más debemos de dar, porque dando nosotros hacemos espacio en nuestros corazones para recibir. Aquí está una dinámica espiritual trabajando, resumida por el mismo Jesús cuando él dice: "Para aquellos que tienen, más se les dará; para aquellos que no tienen, aunque parezcan de tener se les quitará." (Lucas 19:26).

Temperancia (Moderación) también lucha la avaricia, porque la avaricia es el amor excesivo al dinero. Compasión y caridad luchan a la avaricia, porque ellos nos llevan a la experiencia de otros y crean en nosotros una necesidad de ayudar. Justicia es la sed de la honestidad, también lucha contra la avaricia. Un hombre o una mujer con un sentido recto de la justicia puede ver en el exceso de sus riquezas una oportunidad de corregir algunas de las injusticias sufridas por aquellos que no son tan afortunados. Así, como es el caso con la lujuria, que es opuesta por muchas de las virtudes, aquellos que luchan con el pecado de la avaricia tienen la oportunidad, en la lucha, de desarrollar varias virtudes al mismo tiempo.

SIN AND VIRTUE XVI The Sin of Sloth

Before discussing the sin of sloth it is necessary to make this distinction: there are non-sinful emotional states which can mimic sloth. A deeply depressed person may exhibit certain behaviors that we would associate with this sin, but it is not sinful to be deeply depressed. Those battling serious depression may be listless, may be unmotivated, may find it difficult to perform routine tasks regularly or well. But these incapacities stem from an emotional reality with which the person is trying to cope; depression is actually a part of the coping mechanism. There are also those who battle depression as simply part of the fabric of their lives; they have a diagnosable, or clinical, depression for which they bear no moral responsibility. None of this is to be associated with the sin of sloth.

Sloth is a radical abandonment of the responsibilities of one's station in life. It is more than mere laziness, more than dereliction of duty. It is the abdication of one's proper responsibilities, the willful refusal to rise up to and meet the challenges of one's life. The slothful husband and father loses his job and makes no effort to find another. The slothful priest eyes the responsibilities of his calling and calculates just how many of them he can skirt, duck out of, or leave to another priest, and performs only the bare minimum requirements to maintain his standing in the diocese.

The slothful are unengaged by their own lives, have a minimal sense of obligation to others and to society at large, and as they let go of more and more of their proper responsibilities they circle deeper and deeper into an inward and radically selfish spiral, their own inner emptiness attaining an almost gravitational pull. This cycle can be accelerated by substance abuse; drugs or alcohol might seem to relieve the tedium, the emptiness. In such cases, however, the addiction, is a mere symptom of the root problem.

Breaking out of such a spiral requires above all the application of one virtue: courage. We will look at courage next week.

PECADO Y VIRTUD XVI El Pecado de la Pereza

Antes de discutir el pecado de la pereza es necesario hacer esta distinción; hay emociones que no son pecados los cuales pueden imitar a la pereza. Una persona que está sumamente deprimida puede demostrar ciertos comportamientos que lo pueden asociar con este pecado, pero no es pecado para la persona que está sumamente deprimida. Aquellos que luchan con una depresión muy seria pueden ser indiferentes, no tienen ninguna motivación, pueden tener dificultad regularmente en hacer tareas rutinarias o hacerlas bien. Pero estas incapacidades se originan de una realidad emocional por la cual la persona trata de aguantar; depresión es actualmente parte del mecanismo de aguantar esta situación. Hay también aquellos que luchan con depression como una simple fibra de sus vidas; ellos tienen una depresión clínica diagnosticada por la cual ellos no mantienen ninguna responsabilidad moral. Nada de esto está asociado con el pecado de la pereza.

Pereza es un abandono radical de las responsabilidades de una estación en la vida. Es mucho más de ser perezoso, más del abandono de la obligación. Es una abdicación de las responsabilidades de cada uno, el rehuso voluntario y total de enfrentarse al desafío de la vida. El padre perezoso pierde su empleo y no hace ningún esfuerzo para encontrar otro. El sacerdote perezoso ve las responsabilidades de su llamado y calcula cuantos de ellos puede esquivar, salirse de hacerlos, o dejarlo para otro sacerdote, y hace solamente los requisitos mínimos para mantener su status en la diócesis.

Los perezosos son despegados de sus propias vidas, tienen un senso mínimo de obligación a otros y para la sociedad en general y también dejan más y más de sus propias responsabilidades, ellos dan profundas vueltas a encerrarse radicalmente y egoístamente de una forma espiral, adentro de sus seres vacíos obteniendo algo como un empuje de gravedad. Este ciclo puede ser acelerado por abuso de substancias; drogas o bebidas alcohólicas que parecen aliviar el tedium, el vacío. En esos casos, la entrega es un síntoma simple de la raíz del problema. Saliéndose de tal espiral requiere sobre todo la aplicación de una virtud; coraje. Nosotros veremos al coraje próximamente.
