## The Pastor's Page/Página del Pastor

Dear Families of the Immaculate Heart of Mary,

In this Sunday's gospel, which is part of Jesus' farewell discourse, he assures his disciples that he will not leave them orphaned. His impending departure will not leave them bereft of his love. They will not be homeless and will not need to be cared for by strangers. He promises to send "another Advocate" to be with them always. The Greek word *parakletos*, "paraclete," has a rich array nuance. It literally means "called to the side" of another. It can have a legal sense, like "advocate", or "defense attorney." More generally it can refer to a helper, mediator, or intercessor, one who appeals on another's behalf. Another nuance is that of "comforter," as expressed in the sequence for Pentecost, when we pray, "You, of comforters the best," and ask for rest, refreshment and solace.

Jesus does not leave any orphaned. He is the embodiment of a motherly God who never forgets her children (Isa 49:15) and a fatherly God who protects orphans and widows (Ps 68:5). Just as parental love at its best is unconditional, so too is God's love. Although some translations of John 14:15 and 14:21 seem to imply that God's love and the sending of another Advocate are conditioned by human response, the focus is actually on the mutuality of the love. The divine love has been made manifest in God's gift of the Son (John 3:16); human love of God is expressed in the keeping of the commandments.

Again, this Saturday, 65 children of the Spanish Faith Formation received their First Communion. We want to keep these children in our prayers to welcome them to the table of the Lord.

Immaculate Heart of Mary, pray for us.

Queridas Familias de Inmaculado Corazón de María,

En el evangelio de este domingo, que forma parte del discurso de despedida de Jesús, asegura a sus discípulos que no los dejará huérfanos. Su inminente partida no les dejará privados de su amor. No estarán sin hogar ni necesitarán que desconocidos los cuiden. Promete enviar "otro Defensor" para estar siempre con ellos. La palabra griega *parakletos*, "paraclete", tiene una rica variedad de matices. Literalmente significa "llamado a un lado" u otro. Puede tener un sentido legal, como "defensor" o "abogado defensor". Más generalmente, puede referirse a un ayudante, mediador o intercesor, uno de los cuales apela en nombre de otro. Otra matiz es la de "consolador", expresado en la secuencia de Pentecostés, cuando rezamos, "Tú, de los consoladores, el mejor", y pedimos descanso, fresco y consuelo.

Jesús no deja huérfano a nadie. Él es la encarnación de un Dios maternal que nunca olvida a sus hijos (Isa 49:15) y de un Dios paternal que proteja a huérfanos y viudas (Sal 68:5). Igual que el amor parental en su máxima expresión es incondicional, y también lo es el amor de Dios. Aunque algunas traducciones de Juan 14:15 y 14:21 parecen implicar que el amor de Dios y el envío de otro Defensor están condicionados por la respuesta humana, el enfoque está en realidad en la mutualidad del amor. El amor divino se ha manifestado en el don de Dios del Hijo (Juan 3:16); el amor humano por Dios se expresa en el cumplimiento de los mandamientos.

De nuevo, este sábado, 65 niños de la Formación de fe en Español recibieron su Primera Comunión. Nosotros queremos mantener a estos niños en nuestras oraciones para darles la bienvenida a la mesa del Señor.

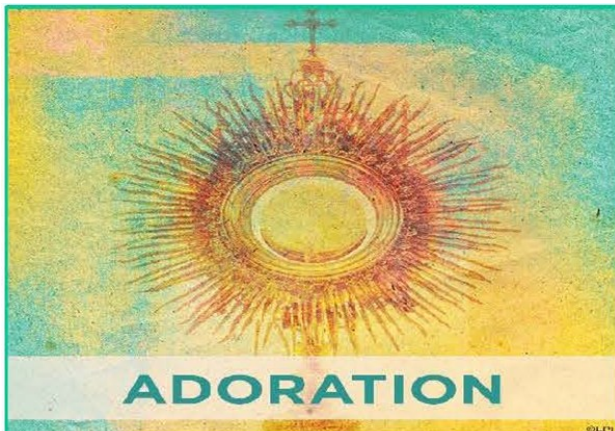

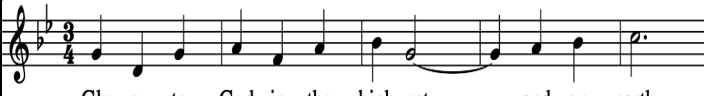

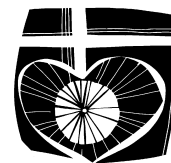

## Sixth Sunday of Easter

Acts 8:5-8, 14-17 | 1 Pt 3:15-18 | Jn 14:15-21

### **GROW AS A DISCIPLE** | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

Several years ago, while praying in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament, I heard the words, "I just couldn't bear to leave you." It was one of the clearest responses to prayer that I have experienced, and it occurred at a time when I was feeling incredibly lonely. I have spent years reflecting on those words, which resurface often as I receive Christ in the Eucharist. In the Gospel today, I hear echoes of those words again as Christ explains to the Apostles the many ways in which they – and we – will not be abandoned after his ascension into heaven. As the rest of the Gospel unfolds, the events of his passion and resurrection reveal the Lord's faithfulness to them. After the resurrection, the Apostles know they can trust his word because they remember Jesus' promise that the Father will send an Advocate to be with them. We, also, can trust him believing that out of complete and utter love for humanity, Jesus remains with us.

### **GO EVANGELIZE**

#### **PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT**

The Apostles accompanied one another in their community of faith, and they walked with those who had recently responded to God's call to know the truth, as we see with the newly baptized in Samaria. In our lives today, the value of accompaniment cannot be underestimated. In our busy world when it is easy to feel disconnected and alone, being with one another is a powerful way to be a vessel through which Christ proclaims his promise to never leave us. By sitting with another in a time of grief, listening to the questions of a friend who is struggling, or rejoicing with a friend in response to good news, we accompany each other through life's ups and downs. Sometimes accompaniment consists of proclaiming the Good News of Christ's love and thereby helping others to have the courage to do the same. In whatever ways we are called to accompany another in their journey of faith, we do so with the promise that Christ is doing the same for us.

### **ACCOMPANY**

In this joyful season of Easter, we continue to celebrate those who entered or were fully welcomed into the Catholic Church at the Easter Vigil. This week, consider reaching out to someone who is new to the Church to celebrate with them, offer your continued prayers for them, or invite them to a parish event.

Mini reflection: John the Baptist recognizes Jesus when he sees him, though there is nothing extraordinary-looking about him. This is how Jesus comes to us today: veiled in the ordinary. He is in the people who are easiest to miss, the easiest to ignore, the easiest from whom it is to turn away.

“Behold the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world.”

Be honest. When the priest or deacon read this line from the Gospel today, did your brain finish it with: “Blessed are those who are called to the supper of the Lamb”? (Mine did. And then I almost blurted out: “Lord, I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof, but only say the word and my soul will be healed.” Because it’s Sunday morning, and I’m tired.)

We hear the words of John the Baptist every Sunday in the Agnus Dei. If you have been Catholic since childhood, the words of this rite are probably ingrained in your memory, like a groove worn across a wooden floor by the scratching of an often-used chair. That’s the beautiful thing about our liturgy: it gets inside of you, and it doesn’t leave. I’ve never met a Catholic, however long-fallen-away, who did not recall the responses of the Mass.

When the priest says or chants the Agnus Dei, he is showing us the Host — the most ordinary-looking thing you ever did see. Nothing interesting about it whatsoever. Nothing that would make a person give it a second glance.

John the Baptist recognizes Jesus when he sees him, though there is nothing extraordinary-looking about him. There is nothing that would make a person give Jesus a second glance, if that person expected redemption to come in a loud, aggressive show of power. And this is how Jesus comes to us today: veiled in the ordinary. He is in the people who are easiest to miss, the easiest to ignore, the easiest from whom it is to turn away.

Consider what the world could look like, if an instinct to love and reverence those people were as deeply ingrained in us as the beautiful words so easily on our lips: “Lord, I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof but only say the word and my soul will be healed.”

Breve reflexión: Juan el Bautista reconoce a Jesús al verlo, aunque no hay nada extraordinario en su aspecto. Así es como Jesús se nos presenta hoy: velado en lo cotidiano. Está en las personas a las que es más fácil pasar por alto, a las que es más fácil ignorar, de las que es más fácil apartar la mirada. “He aquí el

Cordero de Dios, que quita el pecado del mundo.”

Sé sincero. Cuando el sacerdote o el diácono ha leído hoy esta frase del Evangelio, ¿tu mente la ha completado con: «Bienaventurados los llamados a la cena del Cordero»? (La mía sí. Y entonces casi se me escapa: «Señor, no soy digno de que entres bajo mi techo, pero solo di la palabra y mi alma será sanada». Porque es domingo por la mañana y estoy cansado.)

Escuchamos las palabras de Juan el Bautista cada domingo en el Agnus Dei. Si eres católico desde la infancia, las palabras de este rito probablemente estén grabadas en tu memoria, como un surco en un suelo de madera causado por el roce de una silla muy usada. Eso es lo hermoso de nuestra liturgia: se te mete dentro y no se va. Nunca he conocido a un católico, por muy alejado que esté de la fe, que no recordara las respuestas de la misa.

Cuando el sacerdote dice o canta el Agnus Dei, nos muestra la Hostia —la cosa de aspecto más corriente que jamás hayas visto. No tiene nada de interesante. Nada que haga que una persona le eche un segundo vistazo.

Juan el Bautista reconoce a Jesús en cuanto lo ve, aunque no hay nada en su aspecto que resulte extraordinario. No hay nada que haga que alguien se fije en Jesús, si esa persona espera que la redención llegue en forma de una demostración de poder ruidosa y agresiva. Y así es como Jesús se nos presenta hoy: velado en lo cotidiano. Se encuentra en las personas a las que es más fácil pasar por alto, a las que es más fácil ignorar, de las que es más fácil apartar la mirada.

Imagina cómo sería el mundo si el instinto de amar y venerar a esas personas estuviera tan profundamente arraigado en nosotros como las hermosas palabras que tan fácilmente salen de nuestros labios: «Señor, no soy digno de que entres bajo mi techo, pero solo di la palabra y mi alma será sanada».
