Dear families of the Immaculate Heart of Mary,

"Better the evil you know than the one you don't know." Such popular wisdom reflects the relations of most people to change, even when the current situation is difficult. It is easier to hang on to what is, using familiar coping mechanisms, than it is to risk something new that might result in greater difficulties. Such is the complaint of the Israelites to Moses in the first reading. They would rather have stayed enslaved in Egypt with all the suffering that entailed, than to risk the freedom into which God was leading them, a freedom that brought a new set of challenges.

In the gospel Jesus invited the crowd to shift your expectations from outward signs to inner transformation. He has just fed a hungry crowd of five thousand with five loaves and two fish, yet they ask him for a sign so that they may see and believe. They are looking right at the One who is the very bread of life, but they do not see him as such. He tells them that the same God who provided for their ancestors in the desert is also the One who fed the crowd and who gives life to the world. To come to Jesus and believe in him requires letting go of familiar habits like filling up on "food that perishes," and allowing him to give "food that endures to eternal life."

Grazing on junk food or trying to satisfy our spiritual hungers with constant noise and busyness are the "devils" we know. What would happen if we carved out an inner-emptiness to let the bread of life satisfy our deepest hungers and thirsts?

Immaculate Heart of Mary, pray for us.

Preferían permanecer esclavizados en Egipto, con todo el sufrimiento que ello conllevaba, que arriesgarse a la libertad a la que Dios les conducía, una libertad que conllevaba una nueva serie de desafíos.

En el Evangelio, Jesús invita a la multitud a cambiar sus expectativas de los signos externos a la transformación interior. Acaba de alimentar a una multitud hambrienta de cinco mil personas con cinco panes y dos peces, pero le piden una señal para poder ver y creer. Están mirando a Aquel que es el pan de vida, pero no lo ven como tal. El les dice que el mismo Dios que proveyó a sus antepasados en el desierto es también el que alimentó a la multitud y da vida al mundo. Acerarse a Jesús y creer en él exige abandonar hábitos familiares como llenarse de "comida que perece" y permitirle dar "comida que perdura hasta la vida eterna".

Comer comida basura o intentar saciar nuestra hambre espiritual con ruido y ajetreo constantes son los "demonios" que conocemos. ¿Qué pasaría si nos tomáramos un respiro interior para dejar que el pan de vida sacie nuestra hambre y nuestra sed más profunda?

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

When have you grumbled against God instead of consenting, trusting, and believing he would see you through to a brighter future? In this first reading from Exodus, the whole Israelite community laments over their wanderings in the desert; their earthly focus on hunger and thirst leads them to believe slavery in Egypt would have been better than God's freedom for them. When we are struggling for whatever reason, it's easy to forget all that God has done for us in the past and all he desires to do for us in the future. We may not even recognize the very life-giving and life-sustaining "bread" that lays before us, much as the Israelites did not recognize the bread that lay before them in the desert. In spite of our hard-heartedness at times, however, God is truly patient; he loves us beyond measure. Just as he did not condemn the Israelites, he does not condemn us but rather, calls us back to him time and again with love and mercy.

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

As we heard, God sends the people quail and manna - bread from heaven - to satisfy their frustrated longings while preparing them for an even greater "bread from heaven" that is still to come. In the Gospel, Jesus references this Scripture passage and clarifies that it was not Moses, but his Father who provided the bread from heaven. Jesus tells his disciples to "work for food that endures for eternal life" because he wants them to see the bigger picture. He wants them (and us!) to understand that we should not toil only for physical bread, but for the truest food that is lifegiving to our souls - the food found in accomplishing the works of God by believing and following the one he sent: Jesus. We do this by following Paul's advice from the second reading and seek to "be renewed in the spirit of [our] minds," following God's way of holiness. Only in and through this conformity to Christ will we be prepared to go forth and witness to the mystery of our faith.

REFLECT This week, in thinking about how you can "accomplish the works of God," turn to Paul's Letter to the Ephesians. He tells them to put away their old self and "put on the new self, created in God's way." Examine where you might not be seeing your own manna from heaven, and refocus your efforts to give praise and thanksgiving to God for his never-ending mercy and care.

St. Teresa Benedicta of the Cross (Edith Stein) – Aug. 9

Edith Stein was born into a devout German Jewish family on October 12, 1891, in Breslau, now part of Poland, then part of the German Empire. She was the youngest of eleven children. Edith was brilliant and developed a deep love for learning very early. Despite her widowed mother's religious devotion, Edith became an atheist as an early teenager.

In college, Edith studied philosophy, emphasizing phenomenology under Edmund Husserl. His work later influenced St. Pope John Paul II. She became friends with Husserl's assistant, Adolph Reinach, and his wife.

Adolph was killed in 1917, and Edith, expecting his wife to be crushed by the loss, instead found her strengthened by her Christian faith. Later, Edith wrote about this, saying, "It was then that I first came face to face with the cross and the divine strength which it gives to those who bear it."

Soon after, while visiting other Christian friends, she came across the autobiography of St. Teresa of Avila. She borrowed the book and stayed up that night reading it. The following day, she purchased a Catholic catechism, and soon after, she began attending Mass. She was baptized and entered the Catholic Church. She felt she must also become a Carmelite, but she decided to wait until her mother died, as she was distraught with Edith just for becoming Catholic.

Edith began teaching at a Dominican school and continued her study of philosophy, integrating Aquinas and Catholic thought. Twelve years later, in Cologne, she became a Carmelite. She put her life as an intellectual and scholar behind her and became a simple nun, seeking to be closer to God. She took the name Teresa Benedicta of the Cross.

When the persecution of the Jews was in full force in Germany, she was moved to a convent in Holland for her safety. Shortly later, Germany occupied Holland. Catholic protests there resulted in all Jewish members of Dutch religious orders being arrested and sent to concentration camps. Sister Benedicta and her sister Rosa, who was living at the convent, were sent to Auschwitz. They died in a gas chamber two days later, on August 9, 1942.

Santa Teresa Benedicta de la Cruz (Edith Stein) - 9 de Agosto

Edith Stein nació en el seno de una devota familia judía alemana el 12 de octubre de 1891, en Breslau, actualmente parte de Polonia, entonces parte del Imperio alemán. Era la menor de once hermanos. Edith era brillante y desarrolló muy pronto un profundo amor por el aprendizaje. A pesar de la devoción religiosa de su madre viuda, Edith se hizo atea en su adolescencia.

En la universidad, Edith estudió filosofía, haciendo hincapié en la fenomenología con Edmund Husserl. Su obra influyó más tarde en San Juan Pablo II. Se hizo amiga del ayudante de Husserl, Adolph Reinach, y de su esposa.

Adolph fue asesinado en 1917, y Edith, que esperaba que su esposa se sintiera abatida por la pérdida, la encontró en cambio fortalecida por su fe cristiana. Más tarde, Edith escribió sobre esto, diciendo: «Fue entonces cuando me encontré por primera vez cara a cara con la cruz y la fuerza divina que da a los que la llevan.»

Poco después, mientras visitaba a otros amigos cristianos, se encontró con la autobiografía de Santa Teresa de Ávila. Pidió prestado el libro y pasó la noche en vela leyéndolo. Al día siguiente, compró un catecismo católico y poco después comenzó a ir a misa. Se bautizó y entró en la Iglesia católica. Sintió que también debía hacerse carmelita, pero decidió esperar hasta que su madre muriera, ya que estaba disgustada con Edith sólo por hacerse católica.

Edith comenzó a enseñar en una escuela dominicana y continuó sus estudios de filosofía, integrando el pensamiento de Aquino y el católico. Doce años más tarde, en Colonia, se hizo carmelita. Dejó atrás su vida de intelectual y erudita y se hizo monja sencilla, buscando estar más cerca de Dios. Tomó el nombre de Teresa Benedicta de la Cruz.

Cuando la persecución de los judíos estaba en pleno apogeo en Alemania, fue trasladada a un convento en Holanda por su seguridad. Poco después, Alemania ocupó Holanda. Las protestas católicas provocaron la detención de todos los miembros judíos de las órdenes religiosas holandesas y su envío a campos de concentración. La hermana Benedicta y su hermana Rosa, que vivía en el convento, fueron enviadas a Auschwitz. Murieron en una cámara de gas dos días después, el 9 de agosto de 1942.






