Dear families of the Immaculate Heart of Mary,

"How can this man give us (his) flesh to eat?" One's sympathies easily go with the people who ask this question in today's gospel, struggling to understand what Jesus meant by offering as "bread" his "flesh for the life of the world." Elsewhere in Scripture, eating flesh carries a very negative connotation. "Devouring flesh" is the action of evildoers from which the psalmist prays to be delivered (Ps 27:2). Drinking blood is forbidden because the life is in the blood, over which only God has power (Gen 9:4; Deut 12:23; Acts 15:20).

Our response to the One who gives his flesh and blood for our life and that of the world is not only intellectual assent. Jesus gives his "flesh and blood," an expression that connotes the whole person. So, we entrust our whole selves to him, body, mind, and spirit, expressed in our physical partaking of the eucharistic body and blood.

Summer may not be over by the calendar, but it is for students. Schools are back in session in our city. And soon Faith Formation will be starting. First year Confirmation Teen classes will begin on Wednesday, August 21 at 6:00pm and Second year begins on Wednesday, August 28 at 6:00pm. Our RCIC program begins on Tuesday, August 27 at 4:00pm. Our Faith Formation program will begin on Tuesday, September 3 at 3:00pm, 4:15pm and Saturday, September 7 at 9:00am for English. On Tuesday, September 3 at 7:00pm we have Spanish. Adult Confirmation and RCIA for English starts on September 5 at 7:00pm and for Spanish on September 6 at 7:00pm.

Queridas familias del Corazón Inmaculado de María,

"¿Cómo puede éste darnos (su) carne a comer?" Es fácil simpatizar con la gente que hace esta pregunta en el evangelio de hoy, luchando por entender lo que Jesús quiso decir al ofrecer como "pan" su "carne para la vida del mundo". En otras partes de la Escritura, comer carne tiene una connotación muy negativa. "Devorar carne" es la acción de los malhechores de la que el salmista ruega ser liberado (Sal 27,2). Beber sangre está prohibido porque la vida está en la sangre, sobre la que sólo Dios tiene poder (Gn 9:4; Dt 12:23; Hch 15:20).

Nuestra respuesta a Aquel que da su carne y su sangre por nuestra vida y la del mundo no es sólo un asentimiento intelectual. Jesús da su "carne y su sangre", expresión que connota toda la persona. Así que le confiamos todo nuestro ser, cuerpo, mente y espíritu, expresado en nuestra participación física del cuerpo y la sangre eucarísticos.

Puede que el verano no haya terminado según el calendario, pero sí para los estudiantes. Los colegios de nuestra ciudad vuelven a la escuela. Y pronto comenzará la formación en la fe. GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

We tell our children, from a young age through their teen years: make wise choices. It's a sort of catch-all to cover the endless possibilities of circumstances - good, bad, or neutral - they might find themselves in. But what does it mean to be wise? To have wisdom? In today's first reading from Proverbs, we are shown a depiction of wisdom herself, spreading a table where the guests will dine when they arrive. "Come, eat of my food, and drink of the wine I have mixed!" she says. This invitation is echoed in the Gospel, by Wisdom personified: Jesus Christ. "Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him on the last day." Simplicity of heart and the forsaking of foolishness are the only criteria for accepting the offering of wisdom. It seems we are to come and be fed. But how do we discern, in our fast-paced, consumer-based world, what exactly is a wise choice? It's hard to advance in true wisdom; it is acquired by the humble and the simple, not the busy and the overcomplicated. Often, what the Christian deems important the world finds "foolish." It can be hard to keep our priorities rightly ordered, but advancing on the path to wisdom begins first by recognizing the centrality of God in our lives and humbly allowing him in.

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

In Paul's Letter to the Ephesians, he instructs the people, saying, "Watch carefully how you live." I'd like to think that's where we got our "make wise choices" instruction, but I can't be sure. Again, the dichotomy between foolishness and wisdom is addressed. Wisdom is described as being prudent, which is living with one eye in the present, but also one eye toward the future, and being filled with the Holy Spirit. Elaborating even further, Paul provides a beautiful image of "singing and playing to the Lord in your hearts, giving thanks always and for everything." In the life of one living with wisdom, there is a turning toward true joy. Living in a spirit of gladness is in direct opposition to living in a spirit of fear or comparison. Since wisdom and understanding are both gifts given to us by the Holy Spirit, we can invite him into our midst and ask him to increase our wisdom, understanding, and our capacity for joy.

ENGAGE Cultivating wisdom and understanding is a lofty, but worthy, goal! This week, spend some time familiarizing yourself with the Wisdom literature of the Bible (which consists of Job, Psalms, Proverbs, Ecclesiastes, Song of Songs, Wisdom, and Sirach) by reading the introductions to one or more of them. Explore some of the Scriptures themselves.

St. Rose of Lima – August 23

On August 23, the Church celebrates the first canonized saint born in the “New World,” St. Rose of Lima. She was one of eleven children born to her Spanish and Indian parents on April 20, 1586, in Lima, Peru. She was a tiny and delicate newborn, and her parents named her Isabel. Several accounts exist of how she came to be called Rose, but she formally took that name upon her Confirmation.

At an early age, Rose began to model her life after St. Catherine of Sienna. She loved spending time in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament. Rose often baffled her mother, and it was evident that the two had very different ideas about her future. Her parents intended her to marry; her mother envisioned her as Lima’s loveliest bride. Rose took a vow of virginity but did not feel that she was called to be a cloistered religious. Instead, like her model, St. Catherine, she joined the Third Order of St. Dominic (Lay Dominican).

Her brother helped build a small hermitage in her father’s garden where she would live. Rose chose what many thought were extreme ascetical practices and mortifications. She always offered these and all her sufferings to Jesus on behalf of others, especially the poor Native Peruvians, as well as in reparation for the sins of the world. This manner of life greatly offended her family. Despite their scorn for her piety, she helped to support her family. She was considered an expert at embroidery and needlework and used this skill to contribute to her family’s poor financial state and the poor in her part of the city.

Rose died following an extended illness in August of 1617; she was 31 years old. Her family discovered then how the people of Lima loved Rose. All classes of people mourned her death, especially the Indians and the poor, to whom she tirelessly prayed for and ministered. The streets were overflowing with mourners, and the burial had to be delayed several days on account of the crowd of people coming to pay their respects.

St. Rose of Lima was beatified 50 years after her death and canonized four years later in 1671 by Pope Clement X.

Santa Rosa de Lima - 23 de Agosto

El 23 de agosto, la Iglesia celebra a la primera santa canonizada nacida en el Nuevo Mundo, Santa Rosa de Lima. Fue una de los once hijos de padres españoles e indios nacidos el 20 de abril de 1586 en Lima (Perú). Era una recién nacida pequeña y delicada, y sus padres la llamaron Isabel. Existen varios relatos sobre cómo llegó a llamarse Rosa, pero adoptó formalmente ese nombre tras su confirmación.

Desde muy pequeña, se inspiró en Santa Catalina de Siena. Le encantaba pasar tiempo en presencia del Santísimo Sacramento. A menudo, Rosa desconcertaba a su madre, y era evidente que ambas tenían ideas muy diferentes sobre su futuro. Sus padres querían que se casara; su madre la veía como la novia más hermosa de Lima. Rosa hizo voto de virginidad, pero no se sentía llamada a ser religiosa de clausura. Al igual que su modelo, Santa Catalina, ingresó en la Tercera Orden de Santo Domingo (laicos dominicos).

Su hermano la ayudó a construir una pequeña ermita en el jardín de su padre, donde viviría. Rosa eligió lo que muchos consideraron prácticas ascéticas y mortificaciones extremas. Siempre ofrecía éstas y todos sus sufrimientos a Jesús en nombre de los demás, especialmente de los pobres nativos peruanos, así como en reparación por los pecados del mundo. Esta forma de vida ofendió mucho a su familia. A pesar del desprecio que sentían por su piedad, ayudó a mantener a su familia. Se la consideraba una experta en bordados y labores de aguja, habilidad que utilizó para ayudar a su familia y a los pobres de su barrio.

Rose murió tras una larga enfermedad en agosto de 1617; tenía 31 años. Su familia descubrió entonces cuánto la querían los limeños. Todas las clases sociales lloraron su muerte, especialmente los indios y los pobres, por los que ella rezaba incansablemente y a los que atendía. Las calles estaban abarrotadas de dolientes, y el entierro tuvo que retrasarse varios días debido a la multitud de gente que acudía a presentar sus respetos.

Santa Rosa de Lima fue beatificada 50 años después de su muerte y canonizada cuatro años más tarde, en 1671, por el Papa Clemente X.

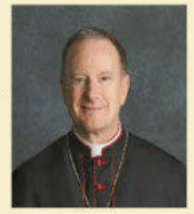

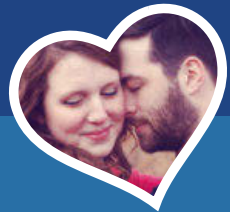
