

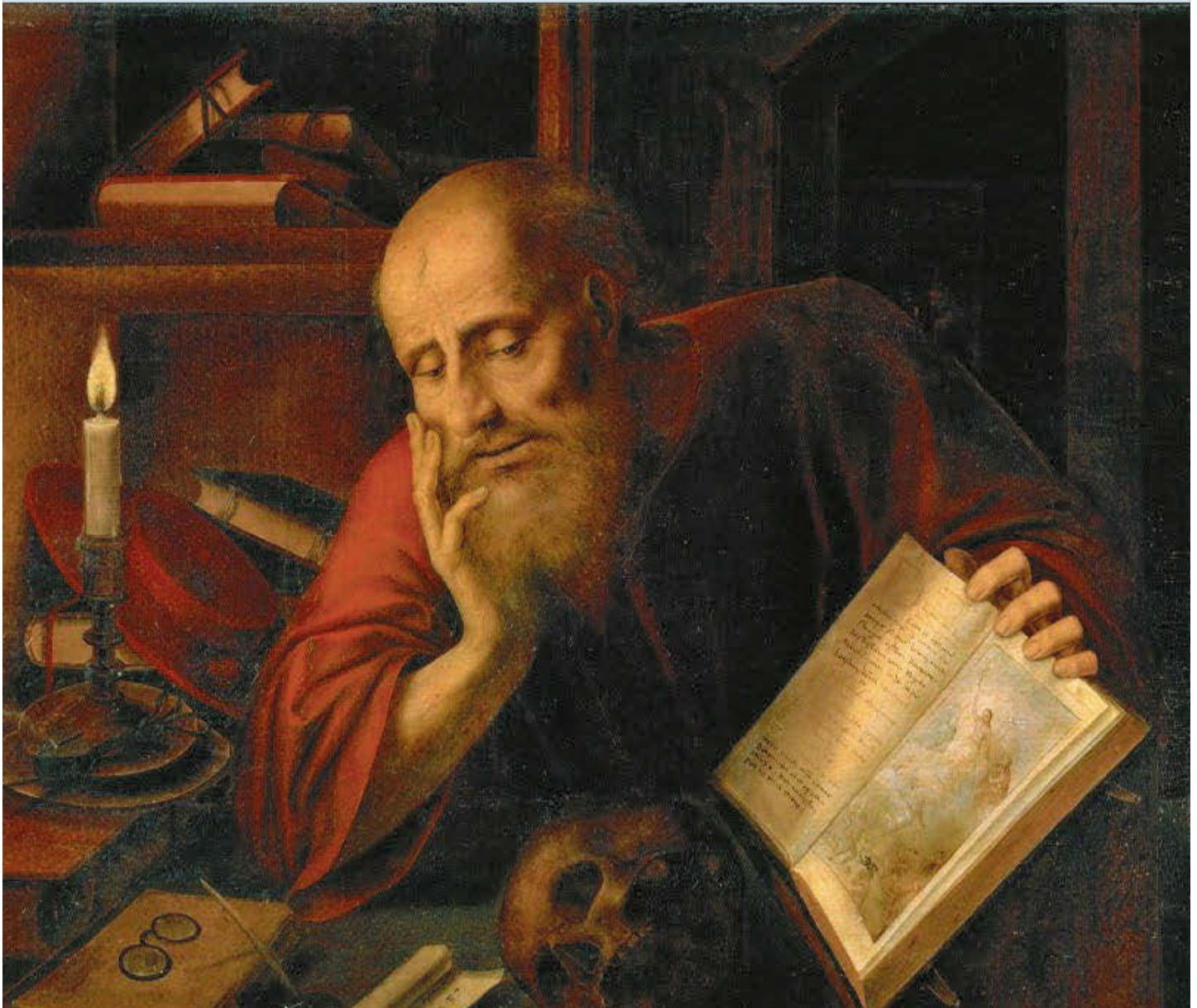

Dear families of the Immaculate Heart of Mary,

Jesus prioritizes the good deeds done by his expansive group of followers. He welcomes those who take action in his name without stopping to ask for their credentials. One could imagine Jesus echoing the words of Moses in today's first reading. "Would that all the people of the Lord were prophets! Would that the Lord might bestow his spirit on them all!" The work of discipleship is not to draw hard-and-fast boxes around who is "in" and who is "out" based on preconceived ideas. Discipleship is more dynamic than that. It operates from an ever-widening circle. Christian discipleship forms followers to see people in need of healing and to respond, period. All who take up this call—this cross—are "in." And let's be clear: being "in" is no easy task.

Christian discipleship demands one's very life. Expectations are as high as the circle is wide for those who live in Christ's light. Along with prioritizing good deeds, Jesus denounces harmful deeds without mincing any words. "Cut it off," "pluck it out," Jesus demands of body parts used to sin. He asserts drowning is the better option for those who cause little ones to sin.

Jesus does not take sin lightly—and nether should we. Sin persists in human beings after the Fall. Every person who walks this earth, besides Jesus and his mother Mary, commits sins. We lie and pass judgment. We lust and hoard wealth. We neglect neighbors in need, harm the earth, and do a whole host of other actions that break relationship with God and other living beings. And we all do it again and again. But we do not walk as people without hope.

Immaculate Heart of Mary, pray for us.

La labor del discipulado no consiste en delimitar quién está "dentro" y quién está "fuera" basándose en ideas preconcebidas. El discipulado es más dinámico que eso. Funciona a partir de un círculo cada vez más amplio. El discipulado cristiano forma seguidores que ven a las personas necesitadas de sanación y responden, y punto. Todos los que aceptan esta llamada esta llamada -esta cruz- están "dentro". Y seamos claros: estar "dentro" no es tarea fácil.

El discipulado cristiano exige la vida misma. Las expectativas son tan altas como amplio es el círculo de los que viven a la luz de Cristo. Además de dar prioridad a las buenas acciones, Jesús denuncia las acciones dañinas sin pelos en la lengua. "Córtalo", "arráncalo", exige Jesús de las partes del cuerpo utilizadas para pecar. Afirma que ahogar es la mejor opción para los que hacen pecar a los pequeños.

Jesús no se toma el pecado a la ligera, y nosotros tampoco deberíamos hacerlo. El pecado persiste en los seres humanos después de la Caída. Todas las personas que caminan por esta tierra, además de Jesús y su madre María, cometen pecados. Mentimos y juzgamos. Codiciamos y abordamos la riqueza. Descuidamos al prójimo necesitado, dañamos la tierra y realizamos toda una serie de otras acciones que rompen la relación con Dios y con los demás seres vivos. Y todos lo hacemos una y otra vez. Pero no caminamos como personas sin esperanza.



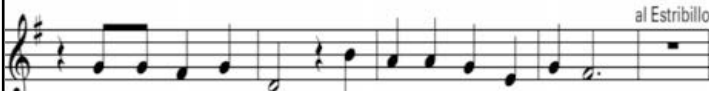

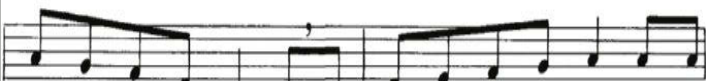

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

Experience, education, and brainpower give parents wisdom and foresight. They can see the bigger picture and determine, for example, that eating an entire box of cookies will make their child sick – no matter how appetizing the cookies *appear*. God, likewise, has a perspective that is infinitely broader and deeper than our own. This divine perspective is the lens through which we must understand the strong language Jesus uses in today's Gospel. God is a Father who loves us unconditionally and who, like the parent who refuses a child unlimited sweets, knows the harm that sin causes his children in this life and in eternity. "If your hand causes you to sin, cut it off." These words, meant to drive home a point for Jesus' disciples, remind us that God desires our good infinitely more than we do, and that this good is ultimately to be united with him for eternity. God *hates* sin in our lives because he *loves* us. If we believe this, no sacrifice will be too great for us as we strive to root out sin, grow in virtue, and follow Jesus with undivided hearts.

Moses' exclamation in the first reading, "Would that all the people of the Lord were prophets!" remind us of the mission, given to us at baptism, to permeate the world with the Gospel of Jesus Christ by our words and example. This is what it means for us to be "prophets." But how do we *become* prophets? And how do we accomplish our task effectively? We begin by engaging in the process described above: leaving sin behind at all costs and embracing lives of virtue. As this process brings us closer to God – especially through prayer, but also through works of mercy – we become increasingly capable of seeing as God sees, making judgments according to his wisdom, and ordering the world around us according to his desires. Our words likewise become more powerful in leading others to Christ because they flow from our ever-deepening friendship with him.

REFLECT What corner of your life have you hesitated to give to God? What attitudes or habits have you been reluctant to invite him to transform? Ask him for the courage and perseverance to give these things over to him and, if needed, to bring them to confession. If you allow him, he will draw you closer to himself and you will become a "prophet" for others in the true sense of the word.

St. Jerome – September 30

On Monday, September 30, the Church celebrates the memorial of St. Jerome, the Saint best known for translating the Bible into Latin. While the exact date of his birth remains unknown, he is believed to have been born between 342 and 347 in Dalmatia, which is in modern-day Albania.

At around 20, he accompanied a friend to Rome to study philosophy and rhetoric. He became a student of a Roman philologist and learned Latin and some Koine Greek. This early study of languages set Jerome on the path he is so well known for. After initially fearing Christianity, he eventually converted and was Baptized. He desired to live as an ascetic and spent time in the desert south of Antioch, where he began to learn Hebrew from a converted Jew. He was ordained a priest and spent time in Constantinople.

He returned to Rome and undertook a few translation projects. He translated some of Origen's homilies on Jeremiah, Ezekiel, and Isaiah into Latin. He then began translating the Old Testament. When Pope Damasus, who urged him to undertake this work, died, Jerome left Rome and went to Bethlehem. There were a couple of reasons for this move. First, he sharply criticized members of the Roman Curia for their lifestyle, and they made his life in Rome difficult. Second, being in Bethlehem, he would have better access to Hebrew-speaking people who could aid in his translating the Pentateuch to Latin. Upon completing the Latin translation of the Bible, called the Vulgate, Jerome wrote extensive commentaries on Scripture. Jerome died in Bethlehem on September 30, 420. St. Jerome is a patron saint of Bible Scholars, translators, librarians, and students.

San Jerónimo - 30 de septiembre

El lunes 30 de septiembre, la Iglesia celebra la memoria de San Jerónimo, el santo más conocido por traducir la Biblia al latín. Aunque se desconoce la fecha exacta de su nacimiento, se cree que nació entre 342 y 347 en Dalmacia, en la actual Albania.

Alrededor de los 20 años, acompañó a un amigo a Roma para estudiar filosofía y retórica. Fue alumno de un filólogo romano y aprendió latín y algo de griego koiné. Este temprano estudio de las lenguas marcó a Jerónimo el camino por el que es tan conocido. Tras temer inicialmente al cristianismo, acabó convirtiéndose y bautizándose. Deseaba vivir como un asceta y pasó un tiempo en el desierto al sur de Antioquía, donde comenzó a aprender hebreo de un judío converso. Fue ordenado sacerdote y pasó una temporada en Constantinopla.

Regresó a Roma y emprendió algunos proyectos de traducción. Tradujo al latín algunas homilías de Orígenes sobre Jeremías, Ezequiel e Isaías. Después comenzó a traducir el Antiguo Testamento. A la muerte del papa Dámaso, que le había instado a emprender este trabajo, Jerónimo abandonó Roma y se trasladó a Belén. Había un par de razones para este movimiento. En primer lugar, criticó duramente a los miembros de la Curia Romana por su estilo de vida, y le hicieron la vida difícil en Roma. En segundo lugar, al estar en Belén, tendría mejor acceso a personas de habla hebrea que podrían ayudarle a traducir el Pentateuco al latín. Una vez terminada la traducción latina de la Biblia, llamada Vulgata, Jerónimo escribió extensos comentarios sobre las Escrituras. Jerónimo murió en Belén el 30 de septiembre de 420. San Jerónimo es el patrón de los biblistas, traductores, bibliotecarios y estudiantes.

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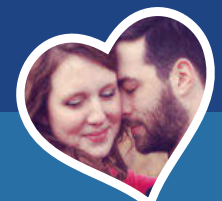
