Dear families of the Immaculate Heart of Mary,

We've all done it—passed street people without seeming to see, hear, or smell them sitting on the sidewalk begging. I usually encounter them when I'm dressed up to go to the theater or on vacation in a strange city. I'm slightly out of my comfort zone. I might catch sight of their shoeless feet or sunglasses or hear the thin request, "Spare change?" Immediately my guard goes up and I pretend not to notice their existence, let alone their need. Chances are they aren't really blind anyway and they'd probably just spend the money on liquor.

The star of today's Gospel is a panhandler. Bartimaeus is blind, yes, but he is probably also homeless and filthy, a real nuisance to respectable citizens. Even so, it is Bartimaeus who recognizes Jesus as the Messiah, places all his faith in him, throws aside everything he has (his cloak), begs him for mercy, receives new vision, and follows Jesus on the way to suffering and death in Jerusalem. How desperate will we have to get before we can do the same?

Así y todo, es Bartimeo el que reconoce a Jesús como el Mesías, el que pone toda su fe en él, tira todo lo que tiene (su manto), pide misericordia, recibe una visión nueva y sigue a Jesús que se encamina al sufrimiento y a su muerte en Jerusalén. ¿Cuán desesperados tendremos que estar antes de poder hacer lo mismo?

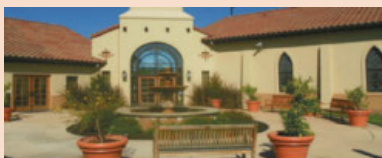

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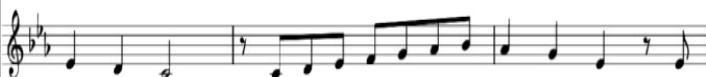

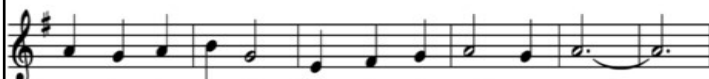

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

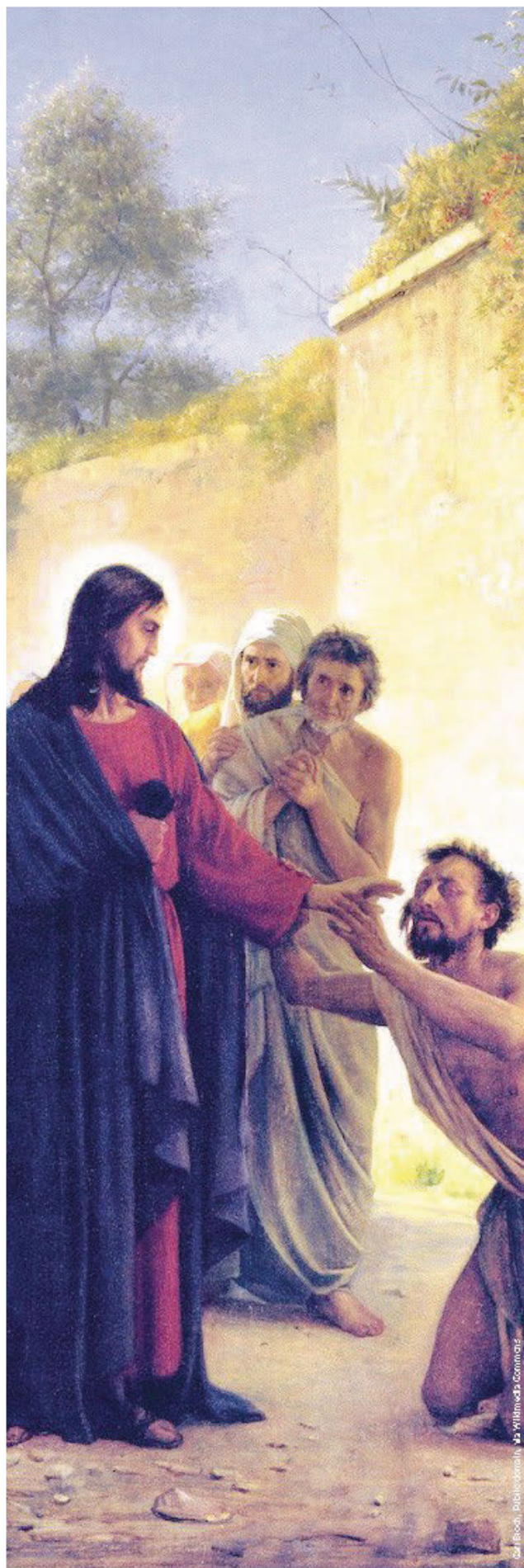
Although today's Gospel recounts the healing of Bartimaeus' physical blindness, the story is a summons for each of us to be healed of our spiritual blindness. Spiritual blindness, an effect of sin, clouds our ability to perceive who we are and who God is. Paradoxically, Bartimaeus' spiritual eyesight is clear; he recognizes who Jesus is and he sees his own desperate need for Jesus' help. For us, however, sin acts like dust, obstructing our vision and preventing us from perceiving God's presence. We find it difficult to recognize God in other people and in the sacraments; and we likewise become incapable of perceiving ourselves as God sees us. If we wish to have our spiritual eyesight restored, we would do well to imitate Bartimaeus' humble, confident prayer: "Master, I want to see." Acknowledging our need before God and begging for his help, we invite him to heal our hearts, so that we, like Bartimaeus, may follow Jesus "on the way."

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

Where can we seek the healing of our "spiritual sight"? We should look for it from the same person from whom Bartimaeus begged to be cured of his physical blindness: Jesus. But whereas Bartimaeus' encounter with Jesus took place amid noisy crowds of followers and curious onlookers, our most intimate relations with Our Lord take place in the quiet context of prayer and the sacraments. Above all, confession and Eucharistic adoration offer us opportunities to meet God and petition him for the cleansing of our hearts. In confession, we humbly acknowledge our need for conversion and invite God to heal us. In Eucharistic adoration, we approach Jesus with the faith of Bartimaeus, seeing past the appearance of bread and declaring that the consecrated host is indeed God himself. Through these eyes of faith, the Lord heals any blindness, and we can see "and [follow] him on the way."

PRAY Choose a regular time to take advantage of the two opportunities for healing we've discussed - confession and Eucharistic adoration. If you do not already go to confession regularly, consider making it a monthly commitment. Finally, set aside time this week to visit Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament, either in Eucharistic adoration or before the tabernacle in your church. Try visiting him weekly - and then watch how your time in his presence transforms you.



The Church and Mary – Immaculate Conception

Last week, we looked at Mary as the new Eve. This week, we will look at the Immaculate Conception. A basic rule of Scripture is that New Testament fulfillments of Old Testament prefigurations, called types, are always greater. Jesus, the new Adam, is greater than Adam. Jesus, the new Moses, is greater than Moses. Mary, the new Eve, is then greater than Eve. Adam and Eve were created in *'an original state of holiness and justice.'* (CCC 375). Scripture confirms this in Genesis after man's creation: "God looked at everything he had made and found it very good. (Genesis 1:31) Sin had not yet entered the world, and Eve made her choice to disobey God in this state of original holiness. Mary, the new Eve, would also need to be unencumbered by sin to make her choice.

Scripture points to this in the Annunciation in the Gospel of Luke chapter 1, when the angel Gabriel greets Mary, saying, "Hail, full of grace." No other angelic appearance in Scripture uses this salutation. This explains why Mary "pondered at what sort of greeting this might be." (Luke 1:29). She would have been familiar with the angelic appearances in the Old Testament and known that no one was ever greeted in such an exulted way.

In the early church, most agreed that Mary lived a sinless life. However, there were deep divisions on the issue of original sin. Those who objected did so because it would seem if she were free of original sin, then she would not need Christ's redemption, making his saving act superfluous. Philosopher and theologian Duns Scotus worked out the objections. He argued that Mary was indeed in need of redemption like all other human beings, but through the merits of Jesus' crucifixion, given in advance, she was conceived without the stain of original sin. Look carefully at the words of Mary in the Cantic of Mary, spoken at the Visitation. "My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord; my spirit rejoices in God my **savior.**" Mary acknowledges that God is her savior.

The *Catechism of the Catholic Church*, paragraph 491, states, "The most Blessed Virgin Mary was, from the first moment of her conception, by a singular grace and privilege of almighty God and by virtue of the merits of Jesus Christ, Savior of the human race, preserved immune from all stain of original sin." This comes from Pope Pius IX's Apostolic Constitution defining the dogma of the Immaculate Conception on December 8, 1854.

La Iglesia y María - Inmaculada Concepción

La semana pasada vimos a María como la nueva Eva. Esta semana nos ocuparemos de la Inmaculada Concepción. Una regla básica de la Escritura es que las realizaciones del Nuevo Testamento de las prefiguraciones del Antiguo Testamento, llamadas tipos, son siempre mayores. Jesús, el nuevo Adán, es más grande que Adán. Jesús, el nuevo Moisés, es mayor que Moisés. María, la nueva Eva, es mayor que Eva. Adán y Eva fueron creados en «un estado original de santidad y justicia». (CIC 375). La Escritura lo confirma en el Génesis después de la creación del hombre: «Dios miró todo lo que había hecho y lo encontró muy bueno. (Génesis 1:31) El pecado aún no había entrado en el mundo, y Eva hizo su elección de desobedecer a Dios en este estado de santidad original. María, la nueva Eva, también necesitaría estar libre del pecado para hacer su elección.

La Escritura señala esto en la Anunciación del Evangelio de Lucas capítulo 1, cuando el ángel Gabriel saluda a María diciendo: «Dios te salve, llena eres de gracia». Ninguna otra aparición angélica en la Escritura utiliza este saludo. Esto explica por qué María «se preguntaba qué clase de saludo sería éste». (Lucas 1,29). Debía de estar familiarizada con las apariciones angélicas del Antiguo Testamento y sabía que nunca se saludaba a nadie de forma tan exultante.

En la Iglesia primitiva, la mayoría estaba de acuerdo en que María vivió una vida sin pecado. Sin embargo, había profundas divisiones sobre la cuestión del pecado original. Los que se oponían lo hacían porque pareciera que si estuviera libre del pecado original, entonces no necesitaría la redención de Cristo, haciendo superfluo su acto salvador. El filósofo y teólogo Duns Escoto resolvió las objeciones. Sostuvo que María necesitaba efectivamente la redención, como todos los demás seres humanos, pero gracias a los méritos de la crucifixión de Jesús, concedidos de antemano, fue concebida sin la mancha del pecado original. Fijense bien en las palabras de María en el Cántico de María, pronunciadas en la Visitación. «Proclama mi alma la grandeza del Señor; mi espíritu se alegra en Dios, mi salvador». María reconoce que Dios es su salvador.

El Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica, párrafo 491, afirma: «La Santísima Virgen María fue, desde el primer momento de su concepción, por singular gracia y privilegio de Dios omnipotente y en virtud de los méritos de Jesucristo, Salvador del género humano, preservada inmune de toda mancha de pecado original.» Esto proviene de la Constitución Apostólica del Papa Pío IX que define el dogma de la Inmaculada Concepción el 8 de diciembre de 1854.

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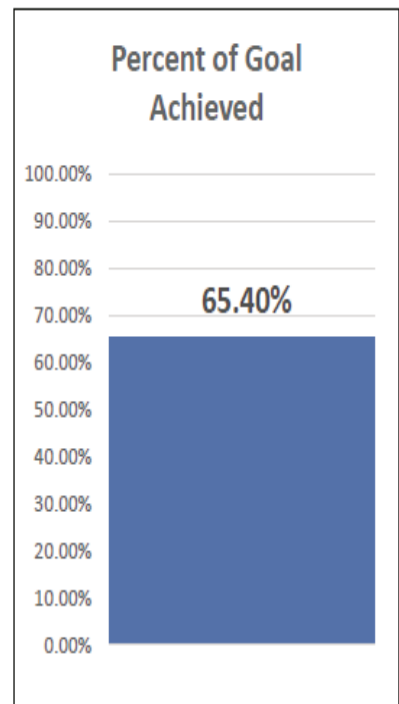

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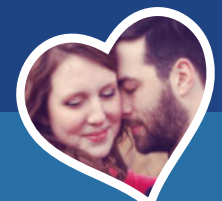
