Dear Families of the Immaculate Heart of Mary,

The suggested readings for All Souls' Day invite us to trust in the mercy of God and in his desire to care for each of us for eternity. "God will reward the just and punish the wicked" is one of the central themes of Scripture and often one of the first things people use to describe who God is—God is "the man upstairs" who judges us when we die. However, such a statement without any addition ignores the foundational identity of God: God is not an impartial judge. God knows us, cares for us, and wills that we should spend eternity with him.

If we trust the words of Saint Paul in Romans, death is no longer something to fear. In fact, by our baptism, we were baptized into the death of Christ. By entering the waters of baptism we die with Christ, shedding the "old self," so that we can rise with Christ. Baptistries in the early church were often built to look like tombs for this reason. In our baptism, we look to the cross of Christ as hope for our own resurrection. If death has no power over Christ, then it can have no power over us, his brothers and sisters. A God who loved us enough to become one of us and die for us is certainly no outside observer. In the crucifixion and resurrection of Jesus for us, God firmly takes our side.

Queridas Familias de Inmaculado Corazón de María,

Las lecturas sugeridas para el Día de los Fieles Difuntos nos invitan a confiar en la misericordia de Dios y en su deseo de cuidar de cada uno de nosotros por la eternidad. "Dios recompensará a los justos y castigará a los malvados" es uno de los temas centrales de las Escrituras y, a menudo, uno de los primeros que la gente usa para describir guién es Dios: Dios es "el hombre de arriba" que nos juzga cuando morimos. Sin embargo, tal declaración sin ninguna adición ignora la identidad fundamental de Dios: Dios no es6 un juez imparcial. Dios nos conoce, se preocupa por nosotros y quiere que pasemos la eternidad con él.

Si confiamos en las palabras de San Pablo en Romanos, la muerte ya no es algo a lo que temer. De hecho, por nuestro bautismo, fuimos bautizados en la muerte de Cristo. Al entrar en las aguas del bautismo morimos con Cristo, despojándonos del "viejo hombre", para que podamos resucitar con Cristo. Los baptisterios en la iglesia primitiva a menudo se construían para que parecieran tumbas por esta razón. En nuestro bautismo, miramos la cruz de Cristo como esperanza de nuestra propia resurrección. Si la muerte no tiene poder sobre Cristo, entonces no puede tener poder sobre nosotros, sus hermanos y hermanas. Un Dios que nos amó lo suficiente como para convertirse en uno de nosotros y morir por nosotros ciertamente no es un observador externo. En la crucifixión y resurrección de Jesús por nosotros, Dios se pone firmemente de nuestro lado.







GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

There's a place in every human heart that harbors the fear of rejection. This can affect our relationship with others as well as our relationship with God. In response, many of us develop coping strategies in an attempt to take control of our lives. When fear of rejection threatens our peace, return to today's Gospel. What does Jesus say? "I will not reject anyone who comes to me." Let's pause to read that line again: I will not reject anyone who comes to me. Allow that message to pierce your heart. Jesus will not reject you. Jesus will not fail you. He will not abandon you. In fact, he has prepared a place for you in his kingdom and is waiting for your response of love.

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

Today, we commemorate all the faithful departed on this sacred feast of All Souls Day. Yes, we mourn the loss of those whom we loved who have died. Even as we mourn, we cling to hope as a community of believers, trusting that God has kept his promise to grant them eternal life. Indeed, as our first reading reminds us, "the souls of the just are in the hands of God. ... They are in peace." In addition to the treasure of canonized saints the Church gives us to admire and emulate, many of us could write a list of "saints" who have touched us in our own lives – those "who have gone before us with the sign of faith" (Eucharistic Prayer I). Think of them today, now. Call to mind their virtue and how they loved those they encountered, including you. Then, let their witness propel you on your own journey of faith.

REFLECT

Though we often associate death with sorrow and grief, for the faithful Catholic, it is also the way we enter eternal life. Heaven is the hoped-for reward of all our prayers, works, sufferings, and enjoyments. As she lay dying, St. Thérèse of Lisieux said to her fellow sisters, "I am not dying; I am entering into life." Still, it is not uncommon to grapple with fear of our own death (or the death of our living loved ones). If you find yourself facing this fear, invite Jesus to gently reveal the source of your anxieties, and ask him to flood those places of your heart and mind with his light and hope. And remember: Jesus will never reject anyone who comes to him.

St. Martin de Porres – November 3

On November 3rd, the Church celebrates a saint well-known for his healing abilities, prayer, humility, and service to the poor. Martin de Porres was born in Lima, Peru, in 1579. His father was a Spanish conquistador; his mother was a freed slave of African and Panamanian descent. Martin inherited his mother's dark skin and was mainly despised by his father. His father abandoned him and his newborn sister shortly after her birth.

Martin befriended a doctor who recognized his intelligence and taught him the art of healing. He began praying at an early age and spent most nights in prayer, always thankful for the gift of redemption that Jesus bestowed on us. He desired to enter religious life, but Peruvian law forbade descendants of Africans and Native Americans from becoming full members of religious orders. He took the only path open to him, requesting permission from the Dominican convent in Lima to accept him as a donado, a lay brother who volunteered to perform menial tasks at the monastery. He was accepted and was later promoted to almoner.

Along with his duties at the monastery, he continued to practice his healing. Martin was endowed with the gift of healing from the Holy Spirit, along with the practice he had previously learned. He became well-known and sought out for his healing, and many poor and sick people came to the monastery seeking his help. The prior of the monastery allowed Martin to be professed as a Lay Dominican, despite the law of the land, and was assigned to the infirmary full-time. He ministered without distinction to the poor and nobility alike. Many healing miracles were reported over his lifetime.

He continued his work as almoner in addition to his role in the infirmary. He begged for alms and fed up to 160 of the poor of Lima daily. When the infirmary ran out of space, his sister, who lived nearby, opened her home to accommodate the overflow. Over his lifetime, he continued his practice of prayer at night. He was a fine example of contemplation and action. Martin died on November 3, 1639, at 59.

San Martín de Porres – 3 de noviembre

El 3 de noviembre, la Iglesia celebra a un santo conocido por sus habilidades curativas, oración, humildad y servicio a los pobres. Martín de Porres nació en Lima, Perú, en 1579. Su padre era un conquistador español; su madre era una esclava liberada de ascendencia africana y panameña. Martin heredó la piel oscura de su madre y fue despreciado principalmente por su padre. Su padre lo abandonó a él y a su hermana recién nacida poco después de su nacimiento.

Martin se hizo amigo de un médico que reconoció su inteligencia y le enseñó el arte de curar. Comenzó a orar a una edad temprana y pasó la mayoría de las noches en oración, siempre agradecido por el don de la redención que Jesús nos concedió. Deseaba ingresar a la vida religiosa, pero la ley peruana prohibía a los descendientes de africanos y nativos americanos convertirse en miembros de pleno derecho de las órdenes religiosas. Tomó el único camino que se le abrió, solicitando permiso al convento dominico de Lima para aceptarlo como donado, un hermano lego que se ofreció como voluntario para realizar tareas domésticas en el monasterio. Fue aceptado y luego ascendido a limosnero.

Junto con sus deberes en el monasterio, continuó practicando su curación. Martin fue dotado con el don de sanidad del Espíritu Santo, junto con la práctica que había aprendido previamente. Se hizo conocido y buscó su curación, y muchas personas pobres y enfermas acudieron al monasterio en busca de su ayuda. El prior del monasterio permitió que Martín profesara como laico dominico, a pesar de la ley del país, y fue asignado a la enfermería a tiempo completo. Ministró sin distinción a los pobres y a la nobleza por igual. Se informaron muchos milagros de curación durante su vida.

Continuó su trabajo como limosnero además de su papel en la enfermería. Pidió limosna y alimentó diariamente a 160 de los pobres de Lima. TEENS: Five How-To's from Thérèse of Lisieux

(Teens - and teens at heart—enjoy this blog excerpt from LIFE TEEN Ministries)

I used to be really skeptical about Thérèse. Many of my friends raved about her autobiography, Story of a Soul, but I was unsure. I wondered how this young girl from a small town in 19th century France could teach me anything about prayer or sacrifice. She seemed to have been given everything as a child, and she entered a cloistered monastery before she had the chance to do anything I thought could be impressive. I'm so grateful I was wrong.

I checked out Thérèse for myself. I read her story, learned about her teachings of mercy and love, and found that, in truth, my life was changed. In this blog, I'll highlight five things Thérèse taught me. She's

a woman of great faith and deep love. Here are some things she showed me how to do.

How to laugh at myself: There'se grew up struggling against scruples, a deep and dangerous scrutinization of one's spiritual actions and merits. She worried she might never be good enough and frequently found herself in violent fits of apology, trying to win back a worth she feared she'd lost. However, when she writes her story as a young adult, she has gathered the grace to look back upon her childhood with goodness and levity. Having gained a powerful perspective of mercy, she understands that the worries she once thought severe now seem to pass like vapor in the wind, trusting that God's goodness outweighs her failings.

How to grow up: Thérèse shines to me as a remarkable example of growth. What we now call her autobiography was originally a series of letters to her religious superiors who had asked her to recount her spiritual journey (hence the work's famous title). She wrote upon the request of others who saw greatness in her, and, perhaps while she wrote, she smiled to see how far she'd come. She, who started as a frightened little girl in a small town, grew into a strong leader of prayer and devotion, even working to train new members of her Carmelite religious community. Unashamed of where she started, Thérèse gives great

glory to God for guiding her into her present.

How to receive mercy: Thérèse offers us powerful teaching of mercy. While Saints like Paul and Augustine of Hippo tell of their dramatic conversions from serious sin to deep grace, it seems Therese never had a "pre-conversion" life. She writes about knowing Christ's love for her since her beginning. Her spiritual director even declared that she had never committed a mortal sin! How then can she teach us about mercy? Thérèse describes moments in her prayer when God showed her even the worst sins of Hell, only then to reveal that His mercy had infinitely greater power. Through her quiet devotion and daily prayer, she knew that no sin was too great for the Lord's ocean of mercy. And she rushed with joy to God at every chance He had to forgive her.

How to pray with confidence: When Thérèse was a young girl, her sister presented her with a basket of different dresses, telling her to choose her favorite. Therese shouted out, "I choose all!" and took the whole basket (Story of a Soul, 27). This cry of joy has become a motto for many under her patronage, for it reminds us that nothing is impossible for God. Thérèse comes before God, having emptied herself; thus, she can be filled to surplus with grace. She often prayed that God would make her a great Saint, even greater than Teresa of Avila! Without fear before her Heavenly Father, Therese bears her heart and trusts that God

will show her His abundance.

How to love without fear: Thérèse is a patron saint of mission, yet she hardly traveled anywhere during her life — she was even a cloistered nun! But, her patronage comes from the great love she poured out to her sisters in community and even in letters to those beyond her convent walls. She trusted that her intercessory prayers had a veritable impact on her world, and she believed that God would carry her love to the hearts of those for whom she prayed. Learning not to fear the sting of unrequited love, she poured out compassion and patience to her sisters in community, even when some of them could hardly stand her. She knew that love was a gift given in deep freedom, having learned how best to love from her Father in Heaven.

Thérèse is a powerful spiritual example for us, shining with patience, grace, and love and growing from a frightened child into a confident woman of devotion; Thérèse models a little way of realistic holiness for all of us. She desired to be great, not in her performances or actions, but in the quiet of her heart, learning to love as Christ Himself loved. So may she serve for us all as a great model of Christian virtues and a generous heart. Saint Thérèse of Lisieux, pray for us!


