Dear families of the Immaculate Heart of Mary,

The scribe who asks Jesus about the greatest commandment is an interesting character. It is hard to get a read on him: this kind of question, from a scribe, is usually intended as a trick for Jesus. His response, though, is one of sincere acceptance, showing an understanding that earns Jesus's approval. Perhaps his question, then, was not a trick but one of an earnest seeker striving after God in love. Jesus's response gives two commandments rooted in love; perhaps the scribe's recognition of the truth in Jesus's answer came from a heart already shaped by genuine love for God and neighbor. In any event, this gospel reminds us that many of our human boundaries fall apart in the face of the God who calls us to love. Jesus and the scribe—usually adversaries—here understand each other and are able to engage in honest dialogue.

The first reading gives the Mosaic command that Jesus will cite as the greatest. The wholehearted love for God that it enjoins upon Israel is the basis for all other commandments. God makes commandments out of loving desire for our well-being, not a desire to control. We are called to obedience but not thoughtless obedience. We are called to respond to God's commands with the same love from which God makes them.

Love for our neighbor and love for God are two sides to the same coin. Where one is truly found, so is found the other. Those of us who are interested and involved in ministry cannot engage in church affairs as one hobby among many. We, like all believers, are called to let ourselves be transformed by our encounter with Christ. Our love for God is evidenced by the way we treat those around us.

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Queridas familias del Inmaculado Corazón de María,

El escriba quien pregunta a Jesús sobre el mayor mandamiento es un personaje interesante. Es difícil entenderlo: este tipo de pregunta, hecha por un escriba, suele ser una jargarreta para Jesús. Su respuesta, sin embargo, es de sincera aceptación, mostrando una comprensión que se gana la aprobación de Jesús. Tal vez, pues, su pregunta no era un truco, sino la de un buscador sincero que se esfuerza por encontrar a Dios en el amor. La respuesta de Jesús ofrece dos mandamientos arraigados en el amor; tal vez el reconocimiento por parte de los escribas de la verdad en la respuesta de Jesús procedía de un corazón ya moldeado por el amor genuino a Dios y al prójimo. En cualquier caso, este evangelio nos recuerda que muchos de nuestros límites humanos se derrumban ante el Dios que nos llama a amar. Jesús y el escriba -normalmente adversarios- se entienden aquí y son capaces de entablar un diálogo sincero.

La primera lectura presenta el mandamiento mosaico que Jesús citará como el más importante. El amor incondicional a Dios que impone a Israel es la base de todos los demás mandamientos. Dios impone mandamientos por amor a nuestro bienestar, no por un deseo de control. Estamos llamados a la obediencia, pero no a la pleitesía irreflexiva. Estamos llamados a responder a los mandamientos de Dios con el mismo amor con el que Dios los hace.

El amor al prójimo y el amor a Dios son dos caras de la misma moneda. Donde uno se encuentra de verdad, también se encuentra el otro. Los que estamos interesados e implicados en el ministerio no podemos dedicarnos a los asuntos de la Iglesia como un pasatiempo entre muchos otros. Nosotros, como todos los creyentes, estamos llamados a dejarnos transformar por nuestro encuentro con Cristo. Nuestro amor a Dios se manifiesta en el modo en que tratamos a los que nos rodean.

It is not surprising that we hear both Moses and Jesus speak the same words in today's Scripture. After all, Truth and Good News bear repeating! The Lord our God is Lord alone! "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind, and with all your strength." In these words, Moses is instructing the people to fear the Lord and keep all his commandments and in turn God would give them "a land flowing with milk and honey" (Canaan). He is telling them the way to live. When Jesus repeats these words around 1,400 years later, the reason and message are the same, but he also adds to them: "love your neighbor as yourself." The two commandments are inseparable. He tells us the way to live, and how to live. It's not enough to *know* what God asks of us, we must *do* what God asks of us: love him and one another. When God is the source and reason for all our thoughts and actions, we too will not be "far from the kingdom of God."

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

How do we put God first in our lives, ensuring he is that source and reason? When *he is everything*? Not a short order, right? He is everything when our heart, soul, mind, and strength are united with his - when Jesus is the lens through which we see the world. The psalm today reveals that it is the Lord, himself, who is our strength. When we surrender to Jesus, he gives us the strength to love him with everything within us. And when we truly love him, we cannot help acting on that love in how we care for and love our neighbor. How will we know he is first in our lives? Jesus' words in today's Scripture tell us how: by accepting God's love for us, by loving him back, his love will overflow to those around us. Think of those whom your life touches daily: your colleagues at work, the barista at the café, those who hit the gym the same time as you and yes, those who live right next door - your neighbors. In your prayers, ask Jesus, "how can I love and serve them better?"

SERVE This week, find a particular and concrete way to love someone who needs it, or who lacks what you have: be a listening ear for someone who has no one to talk to; help a neighbor with physical house or yard work; buy groceries for that person who just lost their job. The opportunities are endless, if we just look for them.

The Church and Mary – Theotokos

In the Introduction a couple of weeks ago, we mentioned the vital connection between what the Church teaches about Mary and what the Church teaches about Jesus. This connection is especially relevant to this week's topic: Mary, the Mother of God.

In the early Church, various heresies developed regarding Jesus' divinity and humanity. The heresy of Docetism denied Jesus' humanity. Docetism derives from a Greek word meaning to seem, apparition, or phantom. They claimed Jesus' human form was void of actual reality; it was just an appearance he took. If this were true, then Mary would not be the Mother of Jesus; she would not be a mother at all. Jesus would not have died for our sins, and the Sacraments, especially the Eucharist, would not be real. This heresy goes against almost all of what the New Testament reveals about Jesus. St. Ignatius of Antioch condemns a group of docetists called the Monophysites in his letter to the Smyrnaeans around 110 AD. This heresy was unequivocally rejected in the First Council of Nicaea in 325 AD.

A later heresy, Nestorianism, named after Nestorius, a Patriarch of Constantinople in 428 AD, regarded Christ as a human person joined to the divine person of God's son (CCC 466). He held that in Jesus, there were two realities, divine and human, that remained distinct from each other. He taught that Mary was the *Christotokos*, the mother of Christ, not the *Theotokos*, the Mother of God. Nestorius claimed that the Son of God was incapable of suffering, even with his union with flesh. He held that the Incarnation was primarily a moral and ethical example for the faithful to emulate. St. Cyril of Alexandria emphatically opposed this heretical view. He maintained in the Incarnation that Jesus, the Logos made flesh, is fully God and fully man. His two natures, divine and human, come together perfectly in one person, Jesus. Therefore, Mary is the mother of Jesus, who is fully God and fully man, so she is the Mother of God. This does not imply that the divinity of Jesus comes from Mary, but rather that in Jesus is the fullness of divinity and humanity. The title, Mother of God, not only affirms Mary's role in the Incarnation but also illuminates the profound mystery of God becoming man.

These two opposing heresies misunderstood Jesus's nature, and in turn, they misunderstood Mary. Immaculate Heart of Mary, pray for us.

La Iglesia y María - Theotokos

En la Introducción de hace un par de semanas, mencionamos la conexión vital entre lo que la Iglesia enseña sobre María y lo que la Iglesia enseña sobre Jesús. Esta conexión es especialmente relevante para el tema de esta semana: María, la Madre de Dios.

En la Iglesia primitiva se desarrollaron varias herejías sobre la divinidad y la humanidad de Jesús. La herejía del docetismo negaba la humanidad de Jesús. Docetismo deriva de una palabra griega que significa parecer, aparición o fantasma. Afirmaban que la forma humana de Jesús estaba vacía de realidad; era sólo una apariencia. Si esto fuera cierto, entonces María no sería la Madre de Jesús; no sería madre en absoluto. Jesús no habría muerto por nuestros pecados, y los Sacramentos, especialmente la Eucaristía, no serían reales. Esta herejía va en contra de casi todo lo que el Nuevo Testamento revela sobre Jesús. San Ignacio de Antioquía condena a un grupo de docetistas llamados los monofisitas en su carta a los esmirnios alrededor del año 110 d.C. Esta herejía era inequívoca y no se podía negar. Esta herejía fue rechazada sin ambigüedades en el Primer Concilio de Nicea en 325 d.C.

Una herejía posterior, el nestorianismo, llamado así por Nestorio, patriarca de Constantinopla en 428 d.C., consideraba a Cristo como una persona humana unida a la persona divina del hijo de Dios (CIC 466). Sostenía que en Jesús habían dos realidades, divina y humana, que permanecían distintas entre sí. Enseñaba que María era la *Christotokos*, la madre de Cristo, no la *Theotokos*, la Madre de Dios. Nestorio afirmaba que el Hijo de Dios era incapaz de sufrir, incluso con su unión con la carne. Sostenía que la Encarnación era ante todo un ejemplo moral y ético que los fieles debían emular. San Cirilo de Alejandría se opuso rotundamente a esta visión herética. Sostenía en la Encarnación que Jesús, el Logos hecho carne, es plenamente Dios y plenamente hombre. Sus dos naturalezas, divina y humana, se unen perfectamente en una sola persona, Jesús. Por tanto, María es la madre de Jesús, que es plenamente Dios y plenamente hombre, por lo que es la Madre de Dios. Esto no implica que la divinidad de Jesús provenga de María, sino que en Jesús está la plenitud de la divinidad y de la humanidad. El título, Madre de Dios, no sólo afirma el papel de María en la Encarnación, sino que ilumina el profundo misterio de Dios que se hace hombre.

Estas dos herejías opuestas malinterpretaron la naturaleza de Jesús y, a su vez, malinterpretaron a María. ¡Inmaculado Corazón de María, ruega por nosotros!

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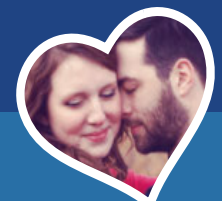
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
