Dear Families of the Immaculate Heart of Mary,

As we enter into Advent once again, we are not preparing for the coming of the Christ Child; that already happened more than two thousand years ago. Rather, in Advent, we break our normal routine and move into heightened alert to perceive more intensely the ways in which Emmanuel, God-with-us, is moving us toward that vision of peace and unity that Isaiah so eloquently describes in the first reading. The prophet dreams of how all people stream toward the city of peace, all dwell in unity, swords are beaten into plowshares, spears into pruning hooks, and there is no more training for war again.

Jesus instructs us to "stay awake," for we "do not know on which day [the] Lord will come." But what does this mean? The prophet Isaiah gives us some hints in the first reading. As we climb the Lord's mountain, we open ourselves to God's ways and follow God's path. We are called to make ourselves available to God and what God reveals to us, willing to set aside distractions and all that prevents us from listening to God. These distractions take many forms, but we must be honest enough with ourselves to name them.

Immaculate Heart of Mary, pray for us.

Al entrar en Adviento una vez más, no nos estamos preparando para la venida del Niño Jesús; Eso ya sucedió hace más de dos mil años. Más bien, en Adviento, rompemos nuestra rutina normal y nos ponemos en alerta máxima para percibir más intensamente las formas en que Emmanuel, Dios con nosotros, nos está moviendo hacia esa visión de paz y unidad que Isaías describe tan elocuentemente en la primera lectura. El profeta sueña con cómo todas las personas fluyen hacia la ciudad de la paz, todos moran en unidad, las espadas se convierten en rejas de arado, las lanzas en los ganchos de podar, y no hay más entrenamiento para la guerra de nuevo.

Jesús nos instruye a "permanecer despiertos", porque "no sabemos en qué día vendrá el Señor". Pero, ¿qué significa esto? El profeta Isaías nos da algunas pistas en la primera lectura. Al subir la montaña del Señor, nos abrimos a los caminos de Dios y seguimos el camino de Dios. Estamos llamados a ponernos a disposición de Dios y de lo que Dios nos revela, dispuestos a dejar de lado las distracciones y todo lo que nos impide escuchar a Dios. Estas distracciones toman muchas formas, pero debemos ser lo suficientemente honestos con nosotros mismos como para nombrarlas.

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

For many in the upper latitudes of the northern hemisphere, this is the darkest time of the year, the time when the duration of daylight is at its lowest. It's providential, then, that our first reading calls us to “walk in the light of the Lord!” Paul tells us that we do this by “throw[ing] off the works of darkness” and “put[ing] on the armor of light.” While we might not struggle with the vices listed in Paul's Letter to the Romans, each of us has our own struggles against sin. As we begin this Advent season, let us take time to do a thorough examination of conscience to discern areas of weakness and sin – those “works of darkness” Paul talks about – in our own lives. Then, consider taking up practices that help you to foster the opposing virtues to arm yourself against these temptations. As you grow in these virtues, you'll certainly be on your way up the mountain of the Lord and walking in his light!

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

Today's Gospel calls us to vigilance. Jesus tells us, “Therefore, stay awake! For you do not know on which day your Lord will come.” While he is speaking about our need to be ready to meet the Lord when he comes at the end of our lives, it's also an invitation for us to always be ready to share our faith with others whenever the opportunity presents itself. As Scripture says, we should “always be ready to give an explanation to anyone who asks you a reason for your hope.” (1 Pet 3:15) We never know the moment when someone will come to us in need of prayer, a word of encouragement, or with questions related to their own spiritual hunger. We must always be ready to meet them where they are and offer a word of hope.

PRAY

Take a moment to pray this week for those “divine appointments” – those individuals who might come your way – seeking encouragement or insight into the spiritual questions in their lives. Ask for the grace to be “awake” so that you're ready to meet them when they come. We can't always predict when these encounters will happen, but we can prepare ourselves to receive these persons as Christ and offer them our full attention and love.

Isaiah in Advent

We have entered a new liturgical year with the Season of Advent. We can make the mistake of thinking that Advent is all about Jesus' first coming at Christmas. The latter half of Advent is when the liturgy focuses on the first coming of the Messiah. The first part of Advent focuses on His Second Coming. The prophet Isaiah is read in the Mass as the first reading every day during the first week of Advent and every day during the second week of Advent, except on Saturday. It is read as the first reading on all four Sundays of Advent as well. In the Liturgy of the Hours, most of the book of Isaiah is read in Advent. We will examine the prophet Isaiah and the connection to Advent over the next two weeks.

We begin with the first reading on Sunday, Isaiah 2:1-5. "In the days to come, the mountain of the Lord's house shall be established as the highest mountain and raised above the hills. All nations shall stream toward it." (Is 2:2) This is a vision of the future glory of Jerusalem, when all nations shall stream toward it. Jerusalem is not the highest mountain on earth now, but this prophecy indicates that in the days to come, it will be. The Hebrew word that the New American Bible translates as "to come" is *'aharit*. It denotes the end or last. So the meaning of the 'days to come' is at the end of time. This firmly shows this prophecy is related to the Second Coming.

On Wednesday, from the 25th chapter of Isaiah, "On this mountain, the Lord of hosts will provide for all peoples a feast of rich food and choice wines, juicy, rich food and pure, choice wines. On this mountain, he will destroy the veil that veils all peoples, the web that is woven over all nations. He will destroy death forever. The Lord will wipe away the tears from all faces." (Is 25:6-8a) This is another eschatological prophecy in which all peoples, not just Israel, will be invited. Jesus' parable of the wedding feast (Mt. 22:1-14) evokes this vision.

Isaías en Adviento

Hemos entrado en un nuevo año litúrgico con el Tiempo de Adviento. Podemos cometer el error de pensar que el Adviento se trata de la primera venida de Jesús en Navidad. La segunda mitad del Adviento es cuando la liturgia se centra en la primera venida del Mesías. La primera parte del Adviento se centra en Su Segunda Venida. El profeta Isaías se lee en la Misa como primera lectura todos los días durante la primera semana de Adviento y todos los días durante la segunda semana de Adviento, excepto el sábado. También se lee como la primera lectura en los cuatro domingos de Adviento. En la Liturgia de las Horas, la mayor parte del libro de Isaías se lee en Adviento. Examinaremos al profeta Isaías y la conexión con el Adviento durante las próximas dos semanas.

Comenzamos con la primera lectura del domingo, Isaías 2:1-5. "En los días venideros, el monte de la casa del Señor será establecido como el monte más alto y se elevará sobre las colinas. Todas las naciones afluirán hacia él". (Is 2:2) Esta es una visión de la gloria futura de Jerusalén, cuando todas las naciones fluyan hacia ella. Jerusalén no es la montaña más alta de la tierra ahora, pero esta profecía indica que en los días venideros lo será. La palabra hebrea que la Nueva Biblia Americana traduce como "por venir" es *'Aharit*. Denota el final o el último. Así que el significado de los "días venideros" está al final de los tiempos. Esto muestra firmemente que esta profecía está relacionada con la Segunda Venida.

El miércoles, del capítulo 25 de Isaías, "En este monte, el Señor de los ejércitos proveerá a todos los pueblos un banquete de comida rica y vinos selectos, comida jugosa y rica y vinos puros y selectos. En este monte, destruirá el velo que cubre a todos los pueblos, la red que se teje sobre todas las naciones. Destruirá la muerte para siempre. El Señor enjugará las lágrimas de todos los rostros". (Is 25:6-8a) Esta es otra profecía escatológica en la que todos los pueblos, no solo Israel, serán invitados. La parábola de Jesús de la fiesta de bodas (Mt. 22:1-14) evoca esta visión.

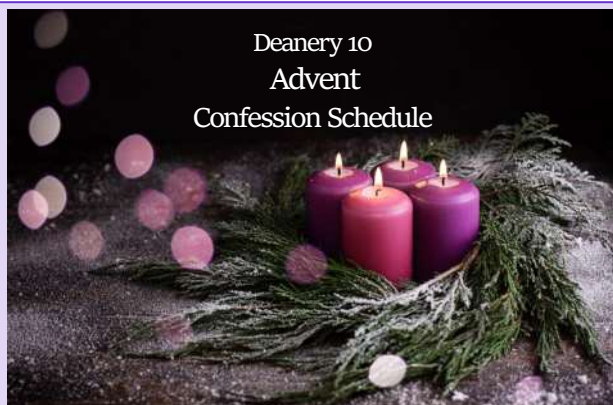

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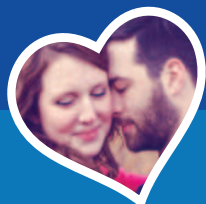
