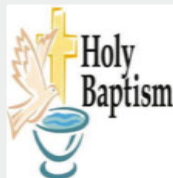

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

On this second Sunday of Advent, when the hustle and bustle of the season is already upon us, I find Paul's words in his Letter to the Philippians very comforting. He says he is confident "that the one who began a good work in [us] will continue to complete it until the day of Christ Jesus." Jesus will continue to be our Advocate and our Rock until the day he comes again. Yes, these are comforting words, indeed. But we know that being a disciple of Christ requires our cooperation and our daily assent to doing God's will. How do we know God's will for us? In his letter, Paul goes on to pray that our love may continue to increase in knowledge and perception "to discern what is of value." In other words, if we are going to be able to choose what is good, we must be able to recognize it and then focus on it.

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

This is where "the voice of one crying out in the wilderness" speaks to us during this season in which we prepare for Christ's coming. It is a season of hope and anticipation, but it also must be a season of preparation. In today's Gospel, the proclamation of John the Baptist takes center stage; he proclaims a "baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins" and says to "prepare the way of the Lord." These words do not suggest passivity - waiting patiently for the Lord to come. They suggest action: Repent. Prepare. Make straight his paths. Today let us consider how we can prepare for the Lord's coming in our own lives. God has made us *good*, and he wants to bring that goodness to completion. As we continue in this Advent season, let us stay focused on recognizing and choosing "what is of value" in our lives so that we are able to truly rejoice that the Lord draws near.

A Very Marian Week

Over the last seven weeks, we have examined what the Church teaches about Mary. We have explored the Marian dogmas: the Immaculate Conception, the Perpetual Virginity, the Mother of God, and the Assumption. We have also examined Mary as Queen of Heaven. This week in the Church calendar is a very Marian week!

December 8 is the traditional date for the Feast of the Immaculate Conception. Since it falls on a Sunday this year, the feast is moved to Monday, December 9. That day is also the Memorial of St. Juan Diego, the saint who wore the tilma that holds the Image of Our Lady of Guadalupe.

December 10 is the Memorial of Our Lady of Loreto. This is the title of the Virgin Mary concerning the Holy House of Loreto and the image of Mary and Jesus that is contained within. A basilica in Loreto, Italy, has been built around a house believed to have been a house in which Our Lady once lived. Tradition holds the house was miraculously 'carried by angels' from the Holy Land to Croatia to protect it from Muslim invaders. Later, it was moved, again by angels, to Italy. In the 1600s, a Mass and a Marian litany, the Litany of Loreto, was approved. Many people today still pray this litany after praying the Rosary.

December 11 was historically celebrated at Our Lady Queen of Angels in France. Three French merchants were passing through a forest and were robbed and left tied to trees. The three prayed fervently to Our Lady as they were all alone. The next day, angels appeared and released them.

December 12 is the Memorial of Our Lady of Guadalupe, the Patroness of Mexico and the Americas. Our Lady of Guadalupe's appearance led to millions of people's conversion to Catholicism. In the Acts of the Apostles, Peter's Pentecost speech led to the Baptism of 3000 people. The number of conversions from Our Lady's appearance in Mexico is equivalent to that each day for a decade!

Thank you, Blessed Mother, for leading us to Christ. Immaculate Heart of Mary, pray for us!

Una Semana muy Mariana

Durante las últimas siete semanas, hemos examinado lo que la Iglesia enseña sobre María. Hemos explorado los dogmas marianos: la Inmaculada Concepción, la Virginitad Perpetua, la Madre de Dios y la Asunción. También hemos examinado a María como Reina del Cielo. Esta semana del calendario de la Iglesia es muy mariana.

El 8 de diciembre es la fecha tradicional de la fiesta de la Inmaculada Concepción. Como este año cae en domingo, la fiesta se traslada al lunes 9 de diciembre. Ese día es también la memoria de San Juan Diego, el santo que llevó la tilma que sostiene la imagen de Nuestra Señora de Guadalupe.

El 10 de diciembre es la memoria de Nuestra Señora de Loreto. Es la advocación de la Virgen María relativa a la Santa Casa de Loreto y a la imagen de María y Jesús que contiene. En Loreto (Italia) se ha construido una basílica en torno a una casa en la que se cree que vivió la Virgen. Según la tradición, la casa fue milagrosamente «llevada por los ángeles» desde Tierra Santa a Croacia para protegerla de los invasores musulmanes. Más tarde, los ángeles la trasladaron a Italia. En el siglo XVII se aprobó una misa y una letanía mariana, las Letanías de Loreto. Todavía hoy, muchas personas rezan esta letanía después de rezar el Rosario.

El 11 de diciembre se celebraba históricamente en Nuestra Señora Reina de los Ángeles en Francia. Tres mercaderes franceses pasaban por un bosque y fueron asaltados y abandonados atados a los árboles. Los tres rezaron fervientemente a Nuestra Señora ya que estaban solos. Al día siguiente, aparecieron los ángeles y los liberaron.

El 12 de diciembre se conmemora a Nuestra Señora de Guadalupe, Patrona de México y de las Américas. La aparición de Nuestra Señora de Guadalupe provocó la conversión de millones de personas al catolicismo. En los Hechos de los Apóstoles, el discurso de Pentecostés de Pedro condujo al bautismo de 3000 personas. El número de conversiones por la aparición de Nuestra Señora en México equivale a eso cada día durante una década!

Gracias, Madre Santísima, por llevarnos a Cristo. ¡Inmaculado Corazón de María, ruega por nosotros!

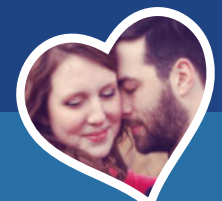

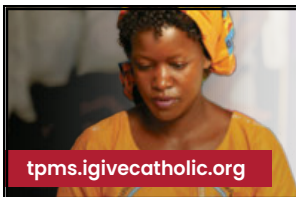
