The Natvity Scene

Saint Francis of Assisi is credited with creating the first nativity scene 800 years ago in 1223 in Greccio, Italy. He said to a friend, "I want to do something that will recall the memory of that Child who was born in Bethlehem, to see with bodily eyes the inconveniences of his infancy, how he lay in the manger, and how the ox and ass stood by."<u>Catholic Company</u>

In December 2023, Pope Francis <u>said</u>, "**people passing one should remember Jesus' birth 2,000 years ago and be moved to silence and prayer in our often so hectic daily lives... Silence to be able to listen to what Jesus tells us from the unique 'cathedra' of the manger," he said. "Prayer to express grateful wonder, tenderness and perhaps the tears that the Nativity scene stirs in us**." Visitors to our churches might be surprised to see our creches displayed through the Baptism of Lord, and the joyful singing of Christmas hymns long past the "world's" timeframe for the season.
